PARTICIPANT GENERAL RULES & INFORMATION

ALL EXHIBITORS ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR BEING AWARE OF AND ADHERING TO ALL RULES. ENTRY IN ANY EVENT/SHOW/DIVISION CONSTITUTES AS YOUR AGREEMENT TO ABIDE BY ALL RULES/GUIDELINES AS PROVIDED HEREIN OR BY VERBAL INSTRUCTION/REQUEST MADE BY ANY OKLAHOMA STATE FAIR STAFF, OFFICIALS AND/OR SUPERINTENDENTS.

ADMINISTRATIVE RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. Oklahoma State Fair, Inc. (hereinafter referred to as OSF), through its authorized officials, reserves the final and absolute right to interpret and enforce its own rules and regulations, and to settle and determine all matters, questions and differences connected with or incidental to the Oklahoma State Fair (OSF).

- 2. OSF reserves the right to amend or add to these rules, as they deem necessary. In the event of a conflict regarding general or special rules, the latter will govern.
- Every exhibit/animal must remain at OKC Fairgrounds (hereinafter referred to as OKCF) until the specified release time. Gatekeepers and other OSF employees are instructed to report any person attempting to remove exhibits or livestock before the release time and date specified for that particular contest or event unless the manager gives special written permission.
- 4. No dogs or other pets are permitted at OKCF, whether on a leash or not. Only bona fide service dogs, trained animals in scheduled acts, OSF competitions and police dogs are allowed. Violations could result in a \$50 fine, impounding of the animal and/or expulsion from the OSF.
- 5. OSF does not permit the use of balloon displays, inflatable decorations, public address systems, electronic amplifiers, gongs, bells, and other noisy instruments without prior approval. Distribution of helium-filled Mylar balloons is not allowed under any circumstances.
- 6. No person will be permitted to distribute or post advertising matter, handbills, fliers, or heralds at OKCF without prior approval from the OSF administration, and then only within the designated space. OSF can demand the removal of any advertising matter it considers objectionable.
- 7. All space is owned and designated by OSF. Management reserves the right to reassign any space, stall or pen not occupied by the exhibitor on any specified date. No exhibitor will be allowed to sublet or sell any space, privilege, stall, or pen without written permission from the OSF. No exhibitor will be allowed to sell or trade entries with exhibitors not entered in the show.
- 8. Admission each day requires the display and verification of an outside gate admission ticket or armband purchase. Re-entry requires a hand stamp and the armband or ticket stub.
- 9. Failure to comply with these rules and regulations will cause forfeiture of premiums and privileges and be considered sufficient cause to bar said exhibitor from future participation at the OSF.
- 10. Firearms: Per Oklahoma State Statute Title 21, Section 1290.22 (D) 3, carrying a concealed or unconcealed firearm is prohibited at the OKC Fairgrounds during the Oklahoma State Fair. This restriction extends to any person, regardless of their professional licensing, occupation, or jurisdiction.
- 11. Objectionable persons or behavior: OSF reserves the right to eject or cause to be ejected from OKC Fairgrounds any person or persons it deems objectionable or in violation of any applicable laws, rules or regulations in its sole discretion.

EXHIBITOR'S WAIVER AND RELEASE OF LIABILITY

By completing and submitting any/all entries into any OSF competition, all individuals associated with any contestant, exhibitor, owner, associate, assistant, guest and/or animal(s) hereby releases, discharges and agrees to indemnify Oklahoma State Fair, Inc., the City of Oklahoma City, and the City of Oklahoma City Public Property Authority (and all of their officers, directors, members, managers, agents, representatives and employees) ("Indemnified Parties") from any and all losses or expenses of any kind, civil penalties, crimes, and causes of actions (including cost for defense, settlement and attorney fees) arising from or related to (1) death or bodily injury to any person, (2) destruction, damage, loss of theft of any property, (3) any violation of any law or (4) any other claim, cause of action, damage or expense, which results from or arises out of any act or failure to act, claim, demand or action arising from or by reason of personal injury that may occur to any associated individual(s) or animal(s) or properties entered or attending this Event being held at OKC Fairgrounds (OKCF), whether caused by the actual or passive negligence of the Releasees, while aforementioned individual(s) are at OKCF and/or competing, observing, working in, or for any purposes participating at 2023 Oklahoma State Fair Livestock Exhibitor Competition Guide



the Oklahoma State Fair. All associates as mentioned herein voluntarily agree to the release and waiver of liability and indemnity agreement as indicated by their submission of entries and their presence at the OKCF. All involved individuals are aware of and understand Oklahoma Statutes, Section 50 of Title 76 pertaining to the Oklahoma Livestock Liability Limitations Act. The person submitting these entries, therein agrees to accept authority to act as agent for actual and/or recorded owner(s) of any/all animal(s) being entered, if applicable, and, in doing so, indicates acceptance of all rules, regulations, liability limitations for all individuals so named as owner, trainer, agent, exhibitor, rider, handler, groom, guest and/or showman. The person submitting these entries accepts responsibility and verifies accuracy of all information provided herein.

This release and waiver shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Oklahoma.

NON-LIABILITY TO EXHIBITORS AND PATRONS

- 1. All property of every character entered for competition, display or any other purpose, or brought to OKCF, by any person, shall be subject to the rules and regulations prescribed by OSF.
- In no case, shall the OSF, its Board of Directors, officers, agents, representatives, servants, or employees be held responsible for any person coming to OKCF for damage, injury, death or disability by disease, theft, or any other cause.
- 3. OSF hereby refuses to assume any responsibility for the safety, as bailee or otherwise, of any property brought to OKCF.
- 4. If the property owners, or others interested in the property, desire protection against loss, damage or injury from fire, or any other cause, must make their own arrangements and pay for such insurance.

CLAIMS FOR INJURY

- OSF expressly refuses to assume any liability for injuries to any patron coming to OKCF, and no claims for injury to any person or property shall ever be asserted, or suit initiated or maintained against OSF, its Board of Directors, officers, agents, representatives, servants or employees for said cause by any person having license or privilege to exhibit at OKCF or occupying any space thereon, and it is part of the consideration for such license or privilege that such claims for damage are specifically waived.
- 2. If any damage, loss or injury to person or property shall be caused by reason of negligence or willful act of any person, firm or corporation, other agent, representatives, servants, or employees having license or privilege to exhibit on OKCF property. OSF shall, in no manner, be responsible therefore, and in case to be subjected to any expense or liability, all persons causing same or liable therefore shall indemnify the OSF.

TRAFFIC/VEHICLE REGULATIONS

- 1. Notice is hereby specifically given that in admitting vehicles to OKCF, whether those of exhibitors or patrons, and in permitting the bringing of any other property to OKCF, OSF does not assume any responsibility therefore, or accept the custody thereof, nor assume the personal control thereof in any manner.
- 2. No motorcycles, ATV's, bicycles, skates, segways, skateboards, rollerblades, scooters or any other powered or non-powered device of a similar nature will be permitted into the OSF operating area (except for ADA needs). Use of individual/privately owned golf carts or other similar motorized transport within the OKC Fairgrounds gates is strictly prohibited. Minors without a valid driver's license are not allowed to operate any motorized vehicle.
- 3. Proper credentials are required at all times for access to parking and inside the OKCF.
- 4. Passenger vehicles and trailers will be directed to the appropriate parking facilities. Vehicles parked in unauthorized areas will be reported to OSF police and subsequently towed and/or impounded. The owner or driver may be required to pay towing charges to recover the vehicle.

REMAINING ON GROUNDS OVERNIGHT

1. Overnight parking for motorhomes, recreational vehicles or living quarter trailers is restricted to the RV lots at OKCF. Please visit the OKCF website for current information.



LIVESTOCK SHOW RULES & REGULATIONS

JUNIOR/YOUTH SHOW ELIGIBILITY

- 1. All Junior Show exhibitors, other than the divisions with exceptions noted below, must be a bona fide member of an official 4-H Club or FFA chapter in the United States.
- 2. Junior and youth exhibitors may enter the open shows, for those breeds offering open shows, by filling out the appropriate forms and payment of applicable fees, except where otherwise noted. See the appropriate open division competition guide for entry fees, class schedules, etc.

3. JUNIOR SHOW EXHIBITOR ELGIBILITY

- i. **4-H Eligibility**: Youth may enroll in 4-H on August 1 if they are 8 AND in the 3rd grade on September 1. If they turn 8 after September 1 and are in 3rd grade, they will not be eligible to enroll in 4-H until the next 4-H year, but they may participate as a Cloverbud. When a child turns 9, they may join as a 4-H member regardless of grade level. 4-H membership ends on July 31 following the completion of the 12th grade, equivalency of 12th grade, GED or having reached the age of 19 on or before September 1, whichever comes first. Graduated high school seniors may complete their 4-H career by exhibiting in the fall fairs. A 4-H member's enrollment status must have been "active" the previous year to exhibit in the fall fairs.
- ii. **FFA Eligibility:** Any student in grades 8-12 must be regularly enrolled in a year-long course of study in agricultural education at school in order to be eligible to participate in any FFA activity. Students in the seventh grade are not eligible for FFA membership in Oklahoma.

iii. Junior Show Exceptions:

- i. Division 1007 Junior Brangus: Refer to age restrictions as defined by the International Junior Brangus Breeders Association (IJBBA) rules available at https://juniorbrangus.com/.
- ii. Division 1027 Junior Miniature Hereford Refer to age restrictions as defined by the American Hereford Association (AHA) rules available at https://hereford.org/
- iii. Division 1034 & 1036: Junior Shorthorn/ShorthornPlus: Refer to age restrictions as defined by American Junior Shorthorn Association (AJSA) rules available at https://juniorshorthorn.org/.
- iv. Division 1240-1241: National Natural Colored Wool Growers Show: Refer to age restrictions as defined by the Natural Colored Wool Growers Show rules available at https://ncwga.org/
- 4. YOUTH SHOW EXHIBITOR ELGIBILITY: Youth do not have to be a 4-H or FFA member to participate. Youth must be no older than 19 years old by September 1.
- 5. Youth who have been declared ineligible to participate in extracurricular activities by their local school administration will be declared ineligible to participate in OSF shows. Youth who are eligible on the first day of the show will be considered eligible through the duration of the OSF. Similarly, youth who are considered ineligible to participate in the OSF will be considered ineligible for the duration of the show. If an exhibitor is ineligible to participate in the OSF for any reason, including rules of the Oklahoma Secondary Schools Activity Association (OSSAA), the animals owned by the exhibitor are also ineligible. Ineligible youth who participate in the show, forfeit all show premiums and awards, and will be subject to disciplinary action as provided by the local school policies. It will be the responsibility of the local school administration to notify OSF management if a particular student is ineligible to participate.
- 6. Attire: It is expected all exhibitors dress neatly with pride and in tradition with each show/division when presenting

UPDATED their animal(s). Exhibitors who are 4-H/FFA members showing in any division must dress in clean pressed jeans, clean shirt with collar and club emblem (4-H/FFA). 4-H/FFA jackets are acceptable but not required. T-shirts and headwear are not allowed. No 4-H/FFA emblem can be worn by an exhibitor not enrolled in 4-H/FFA.

ANIMAL OWNERSHIP ELIGIBILITY

- 1. Junior and youth livestock exhibitors must have continuously owned, and personally cared for, their animals since **July 1** of the current year for all breeding beef, dairy, sheep, swine, and goats.
- 2. For all breeding animals, exhibitors must have registration papers in their own name and be able to produce the originals, no copies. Registration papers must be transferred to the exhibitor's name by **July 1** of the current year.
- 3. Any animal that has been sold at a premium auction at any show preceding the OSF is not eligible to be exhibited.
- 4. Animals that are owned jointly or fed on a partnership basis with an adult are not eligible to show in the junior or youth livestock shows at the OSF. 4-H/FFA exhibitors must be the sole owners of any animal they show in the junior or youth livestock shows.

ENTRY INFORMATION & RULES

ENTRY DEADLINES/PROCEDURES

- 1. The online entry process will open July 1, 2023 and close at midnight September 13, 2023 and all entries must be processed online. However, entries are accepted until the close of check-in for the breed/species show (see rule #4 below).
- **NEW** S Entries processed and paid for between July 1 August 25 will incur no late fees.
 - a. Any changes, unpaid balances or additions made after August 25 to entries previously submitted will be subject to additional late fees as noted below.
- NEW 🔽 Entries made after August 26 will incur late fees AND will not receive complimentary admission or parking passes.
 - a. See the following section "Livestock Show Fees" for the breakdown of entry fees.
 - 4. Starting September 14, late entries must be submitted via hard copy/entry forms complete with all necessary paperwork and fees directly to the Livestock Show office. No entries will be accepted after check-in closes of the intended show. 5.
 - Deadline Exceptions for Other Agricultural Competitions: See specific competition guides and information for
- UPDATED Alfalfa Hay Contest, Giant Pumpkin Weigh-Off, and Youth Extemporaneous Speech Contest. All fees associated with all entries in all shows must be paid via acceptable credit card at the time entries are 6. submitted on ShoWorks. Checks will no longer be accepted.
 - Breed Sanctioning Additions: OSF reserves the right to accept additional entries to attain breed sanctioning rules. 7. Additional fees may apply.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

- 1. A legible and accurate **W-9 form** must be submitted to the Livestock Show Office on or before September 25 for all payees who anticipate cumulative premiums that may exceed \$599. It should be made clear as to which exhibitor account(s) the form is to be associated. Oklahoma State Fair, Inc is not responsible for procuring this document. Premiums may be forfeited if a correct form is not received by the deadline. You may fax this document to the attention of the Livestock Dept. at 405-948-4129; mail to the address given below or present in person to the Livestock Show Office. Check the first few pages of this guide for options in sending your document.
- 2. Any outstanding balance due to denied credit card payments must be paid via cash, cashier's check, or money order. OSF has the right to ban any exhibitor from future participation should there be a continuous problem.
- 3. Exhibitors make entries with the distinct understanding that their stock must be brought to the show ring for judging at the request of the superintendent or announcer. Any exhibitor refusing to do so, without just cause, when requested by the superintendent in charge, may forfeit any premium money previously won, and may also be required to remove their stock from OKCF within six (6) hours, after such refusal, possibly barring them from further showing at the OSF.
- Entry into any OSF event/show automatically authorizes the use of any photographs, videos, audios, cablecasts, 4. or other likenesses, procured while in attendance, of any individual or group associated with any livestock/animal so entered or involved in competition or exhibition at the OSF. Exhibitors are not allowed access to the static photographer's backdrops or stations without prior receipt of express permission from the appropriate OSF contracted photographer.

ENTRY REFUNDS

Refunds for voluntary scratched or cancelled entries will not be granted. Desired refunds for entries scratched or 1 cancelled due to exhibitor or animal injury or illness must be submitted on the appropriate cancellation form, to the livestock show office no later than 4 p.m. on the day prior to the first affected class/show. (Contact OSF Livestock Show Office for the appropriate form). No refunds will be issued for processing fees, stalls, pens, space and/or admission tickets. For refunds of entry fee overpayment: refunds on entry fees will be considered with completion and submission of OSF Credit Refund Request form. No refunds of less than \$10 will be issued.



ARENA/BARN RULES

- OSF management will assign all stalls. Exhibitors making entries and not exhibiting will forfeit all fees paid for stalls, pens, space, or admission tickets. No stalls will be used for any purpose other than to stall competing livestock and those stalls that have been assigned to accommodate breed association booths. Exhibitors placing animals or equipment in any stalls not assigned specifically by OSF management may be expelled from the property, forfeiting any fees paid. Management reserves the right to return entries when stall or tie out numbers are full.
- 2. It is permissible for exhibitors to bring their own feed and/or bedding, only straw or course shavings, but absolutely no deliveries, bulk or otherwise, from any other supplier may be made to OKCF during the OSF.
- 3. For your convenience, **feed and bedding** is available at OKCF. Feed and Bedding is located west of Barn 7 and Gate 7. Call the Feed and Bedding office (405-948-6786) for current prices.
- 4. The use of electric, open flame or space heaters is prohibited. Cooking or any heat/flame food preparation is not allowed in the barns.
- 5. All fans used in the livestock area are to be attached in the following manner:
 - a. Beef/Dairy: All fans must be hung securely above the tie area or on the stall. No fans will be allowed to operate from the center aisle or side aisle alley.
 - b. Swine/Sheep/Goats/Other: Fans must be attached to the pens or on a pedestal in the pen. No fans will be allowed to operate from any position in the center aisle or in the side alley aisle. There will be no cords across the center aisle and the user must tape down any cords used in the alley.
 - c. Personal Port-a-Cools are prohibited.
- 6. Any electrical equipment used in the barns must conform to manufacturer's specifications. Management strongly urges the use of fans with a three-wired ground plug. All electrical cords must be Underwriters Approved (UA).
- 7. Any form of penetrating nails, staples, tacks, screws, wire, fasteners, etc., as well as permanent tape, adhesives, glues, paints, or other markers/marking materials is prohibited. Any damage or alteration caused by the use of any of these types of items will be charged to the exhibitors and may be cause for expulsion from OKCF. Flyers, advertisements, or any other documents cannot be posted anywhere other than on the specific bulletin boards in the barns, other than those for exclusive use by OSF management.
- 8. Management will assign tie outs for beef cattle in designated areas only, as space allows.
- 9. Wash animals in assigned and designated wash racks only. OSF staff and management will indicate appropriate wash racks for each species. Do not wash animals in stalls, walkways, streets, or any other non-designated area.
- 10. Taking animals into wash racks not allocated to a specific species or failing to remove animals from any arena/stall area and/or wash rack when so instructed will be considered unacceptable action/behavior and subject to immediate expulsion from the OKC Fairgrounds and possible future ban from the Oklahoma State Fair competitions.
- 11. Transfer animal waste from the stall to poly carts and return poly carts to main aisle, if moved. Immediately remediate any spills of animal waste during the transfer process and place all spilled animal waste in bins.
- 12. OSF is committed to maintaining a tobacco-free environment in all its buildings, barns, and arenas. The use of all tobacco products (including cigarettes, electronic cigarettes, cigars, pipes, and smokeless tobacco) is prohibited except in specifically designated areas.



EXHIBITOR DUTIES and PRIVILEGES

- The use of any drug or chemical compound that is not approved by the FDA for use in meat animals is prohibited. The illegal administration of approved drugs and compounds is also prohibited. All animals entered in the OSF are subject to blood, urine, and tissue tests by the OSF, FDA and USDA for illegal substances and substances that exceed the acceptable levels established by the USDA, FDA, FARD and EPA. A positive test will result in disqualification.
- 2. The exhibitor will assume full responsibility for any violation of regulations related to drugs and medications to include withdrawal times and the condemnation of carcasses due to drug rule/regulation violations.
- 3. Exhibitors are required to keep their spaces or stalls clean. All trash must be placed outside the buildings in a designated area. The aisles and passageways must be kept clear. No demonstrations, trophies, decorations, signs, banners, advertising matter or exhibits of any kind are allowed in the aisles or public passageways.
- 4. If it is ascertained that any exhibitor has made, or caused to be made, any false statement regarding any exhibit, or if any exhibitor shall attempt to interfere with the judges in the performance of their duties, he/she shall be excluded from competing or exhibiting.
- 5. Objectionable or disrespectful persons or behavior: OSF reserves the right to eject or cause to be ejected from OKC Fairgrounds any person(s) it deems objectionable or in violation of any applicable laws, rules or regulations in its sole discretion. These actions may also cause ban from entering future Oklahoma State Fair competitions. Unacceptable behaviors include but are not necessarily limited to: a) Entering competition arenas/classes without being duly entered b) Disrespecting, ignoring or failing to follow instructions or directions given by OSF staff, officials, judges and/or superintendents c) causing undue confrontation with OSF staff, officials, judges, superintendents and/or other exhibitors. OSF management may prohibit an exhibitor or exhibitor's employee from competing or exhibiting due to any rude conduct toward an award committee, judge, superintendent, or any official of the OSF.
- 6. Gatekeepers and policemen are instructed to restrain any person from exiting the gates, attempting to remove stock or other exhibits outside of the gate hours indicated herein or without a written release authorized by management. Any exhibitor removing an animal or exhibit before designated release time may be barred from future competition in the OSF and may forfeit any and all premiums and/or awards earned.

PREMIUMS and AWARDS

- 1. All classes with one/single entry (entered, shown, and judged) will be eligible for the class entry/per head fee (only) as premium whenever a Premium is indicated.
- No premiums will be issued until OSF receives all funds from all sources. Premium payouts vary by species/breed. See the specific breed information in the division listings. See applicable aforementioned rules with regard to submission of W-9s.
- 3. In paying premiums, no evidence of award will be recognized unless the judge and superintendent have properly signed the judging results.
- 4. Premiums will only be awarded to classes in the premium list and as noted.
- 5. The judge's decision shall be final, and no appeal will be considered except in case of protest.
- 6. Only two (2) places per class, per exhibitor [ownership entity] will be paid. Group classes and futurities are excluded. Individual animals show in group or herd classes must have been entered and shown in one (1) of the classes for single animals in open show competitions.
- 7. It is the responsibility of the payee to file, in writing, claim for lost or incorrect awards/premiums/prize money no later than November 1, 2023. It is also the exhibitor/payee's responsibility to ensure the livestock office is in receipt of a valid and legible W-9 prior to the end of the OSF. Prize money in excess of \$599 will not be processed or paid without a valid W-9 being on file in the livestock show office.
- 8. Exhibitors will <u>not</u> be allowed to enter the ring with an outstanding debt or without being duly and officially entered and their account being paid in full. Any exhibitor failing to abide by this rule will forfeit any awards or premiums and will be subject to disciplinary action and ban from entering future Oklahoma State Fair competitions. In the event that an exhibitor does show while having a balance due on their account. OSF reserves the right to deduct money owed from any premium money the exhibitor may be awarded.



PROTESTS AND APPEALS

- Any protest must be made in writing and accompanied by a deposit of \$250, which will be forfeited if the protest is not sustained. Protests must be filed with the OSF management within five (5) hours after the award was made. The award is considered "made" when a ribbon or premium card is placed.
- 2. Protests must contain at least one (1) specific charge, stating at length the facts or rule violated. The protest must list witnesses, with contact information, to substantiate the charge.
- 3. Management will not consider any complaint or appeal based upon the statement to the effect that the judge(s) are incompetent or have overlooked an animal or article.
- 4. The right of an exhibitor to appeal the decisions of a judge to management will lie only when it is charged that the award has been made in violation of the rules governing the exhibit, or when it is charged that the decision of the judge(s) has been influenced or interfered with by another.
- 5. All questions, disputes or differences not provided for under these rules shall be referred to management, whose decision shall be final.

FIRE REGULATIONS

The area around the exhibit buildings and barns must be kept free of motor vehicles. Roping off or blocking of aisles in the barns is prohibited. This includes blocking aisles with drapes or other obstructions. Exit doors shall not be blocked with any type of equipment (generators, hay, vehicles) even if overhead doors are open. No combustible materials are allowed in any barn. Designated fire lanes must be kept clear. Vehicles parked in unauthorized areas will be towed away and subject to recovery of the towing fee from the owner.

OKC CITY FIRE MARSHAL'S OFFICE SPECIAL EVENTS FIRE AND LIFE SAFETY FOR LIVESTOCK:

- 1. There shall be NO plastic or vinyl material in the barns, covering for stalls, or used for temporary security of retail vendor booths.
- 2. NO TWO (2) CONTINUOUS STALLS PER AISLE, SHALL BE COVERED AT ANY TIME.
- 3. Only stalls for tack storage, entertainment, or resting can be covered on the top, and will require a working smoke detector. (See #4)
- 4. The stalls can only be covered in a red rosin construction grade paper or butcher block paper, cheesecloth, either regular or restaurant type grade, or 100% cotton sheet.
- 5. Any stalls that are covered containing electrical appliances, (refrigerator, microwave, coffee pots) are required to have an operating smoke detector.
- 6. Any aisle space between stalls can be covered only if equal open space to material does not exceed **4 feet**. If your material is maximum **4 feet**, then the open space between the materials shall be a minimum of **4 feet**.
- 7. Combustible storefront or stall fronts **shall** be treated in ACCORDANCE WITH NFPA 701 to make them flame retardant and a certificate or similar proof is supplied to the Fire Marshal's Office prior to its application. Material that is being treated by user must be done in the presence of an Inspector from the OKC Fire Marshal's Office.
- 8. No portable heaters of any type are allowed in the Oklahoma City Fairgrounds livestock facilities.
- 9. Awnings shall not extend out from stalls any further than 4 feet.
- 10. **NO** tents or canopies are allowed inside the barns, arena, or livestock areas, unless they are NFPA 701 certified. This includes but no limited to EZ-UP style pop up tents.
- 11. NO SMOKING will be permitted in any arena(s) or Livestock area(s) or barns.
- 12. **NO** hay, straw, shavings, or similar combustible materials used for decorations are permitted within any facility unless they have been treated in ACCORDANCE WITH NFPA 701 to make them flame retardant and a certificate or similar proof is supplied to the OKC Fire Marshal's Office prior to its application. (Hay or straw for animals is permissible and can be kept in stall areas for feeding and/or bedding).
- 13. Combustible trash shall be removed at least once a day during the period the arena/exhibit is occupied.
- 14. **NO PROPANE CYLINDERS** that have LPG in them are allowed inside any public assembly area without approval/permit from OKC Fire Marshal's Office.

NEW C Equipment Permits: One (1) equipment permit for their grooming equipment (i.e. grooming chute or stand) will be granted to each exhibitor with their entries.

- If an exhibitor brings additional grooming equipment, then a permit will need to be purchased for each additional chute/stand.
- Permits for additional grooming equipment will be distributed to exhibitors when they pick up credentials. Exhibitors who bring additional grooming chutes/stands and fail to purchase an equipment permit will be responsible for payment before the show. If payment is not collected, exhibitors will forfeiture cost from premiums. Permits must be displayed/affixed on the equipment.
 - Exception: Cattle fitter guards are permissible for use within the stall space allocated to the exhibitor. No
 equipment permits necessary.
- 3. **Animal Substitutions:** Unless otherwise defined in the individual breed/species competition guide, the following policies apply to substitution of entries:
 - Must be submitted in writing with the completion of a substitution form and payment of fees.
 - Substitutions will only be accepted for animals of the same breed/species, gender and owned by the same exhibitor/owner as indicated on the original entries. Proof of ownership and substitution fee must be submitted to the livestock show office no later than 4 p.m. on the day before the affected class.



EXHIBITOR ADMISSION INFORMATION

- 1. Armband(s), according to the scale below, will be issued to each exhibitor paid in full for entries in open, junior or youth livestock shows.
 - **EXCEPTIONS:** Division 1900 Alfalfa Hay, Divisions 1910 & 1911 Ag Skillathons, Division 1903 Giant Pumpkin Weigh-Off, and Division 1905 Youth Extemporaneous Speech Contest. See individual Competition Guides for admission information.
- 2. Armbands must be worn by the exhibitor for entry through Gate 7. Loose, damaged, or non-fitted armbands will NOT be accepted for entry. Lost armbands will not be replaced.  - 5. **MANDATORY**: Valid health papers, as required for each species, must be presented to the Animal Health Inspectors upon arrival at Gate 7. No animals will be allowed entrance without said documentation and inspection. Check the <u>"Health & Sanitary Regulations" section</u> as well as the specific competition guides for more information on animal health requirements.
 - 6. Only vehicles with entered animals or a one-time delivery of heavy equipment will be allowed through Gate 7. Please do not contribute to the congestion surrounding the barns by attempting to drive in with passenger vehicles.
 - 7. Exhibitor parking passes are offered one (1) per registered exhibitor and are for parking of one (1) vehicle with trailer in the exhibitor parking area south/west of the barns or without a trailer, vehicle only, in any other permit/paid lot. This permit is not good for gate admission, and it does not guarantee a parking place and will be issued for the period of time surrounding the dates of entered exhibition only. Subject to availability and rules as stated on the hangtag. Visit https://okstatefair.com/information/parking-and-trams for additional parking information.





ANIMAL WELFARE POLICY

OSF is committed to the humane treatment of all animals exhibited. Every possible precaution is taken to ensure the animals' safety and wellbeing. Any exhibitor found using unethical practices or mistreating an animal at the OSF will be immediately removed from the premises and reported to the proper authorities. All privileges will be withdrawn, attraction fees will be prorated, and premiums will not be awarded.

ANIMAL EXHIBITS, SHOWS AND COMPETITIONS

It is the responsibility of the owner/exhibitor/handler/agent for each animal being brought to OKCF to be aware of and adhere to the most current rules and regulations regarding animal transportation, disease control, vaccinations, and health documentation requirement, in accordance with the Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food and Forestry, Animal Industry Services. For the most current information, call 405-522-6141 or access the Animal Industry State Veterinarian – ODAFF (ok.gov) and scroll down to the section for Animal Movement and Importation.

Any animal not cleaned or fitted to show as a true representative of the breed it represents shall be disqualified, and the judges will not award premiums on such animal. Exhibitors are requested to see that their attendants are neatly and appropriately dressed when their animals enter the show ring. Herdspersons are requested to present an attractive and appealing barn exhibit(s), by keeping their stall areas neat and clean, keeping the spectator walkways clear of all straw, feed, etc., refraining from cooking in the barns, keeping audio equipment at a low volume, following any fire and life-safety rules, and maintaining positive behavior at all times.

- A. Summary of Program: Exhibitors show animals for many reasons. The exhibition provides education to the public about livestock and farm animals, as well as the overall agriculture industry. Competition in the show ring provides a forum for comparison of livestock animals, based on selected or desired characteristics and genetics. The results contribute to breed and overall species improvement. These selected characteristics reflect in the market and usually follow consumer demand for a certain type of product, example: leaner meat. The Fair also provides advertisement for the breeders and owners of the animals. The 4-H and FFA programs and other junior organizations, teach valuable skills to youth, such as, finance management, responsibility, decision making and leadership.
- B. Education: The OSF has several educational exhibits and programs designed to educate, entertain, and inform the public about livestock and agriculture. The Fair utilizes judging commentators during the livestock shows to involve and inform the public about what is taking place in the show ring. Commentators cover what the judge is looking for in the animals, judging terminology (or "reasons"), as well as fun and educational information about the judged animals. The junior livestock exhibitors display educational exhibits in the livestock area during the Fair. The Fair has a special livestock exhibit area designed to provide species diversity and special education.

C. Livestock Exhibits

- 1. Exhibitor Guidelines
 - a) The Fair expects exhibitors to be knowledgeable about exhibit rules, about their projects and always to be prepared to answer questions. The exhibitor's role is that of an ambassador.
 - b) Exhibitors should learn additional details about animals and their roles in society. For example: it is fun and interesting to share by-product uses and other facts with the public. The Fair encourages educational exhibits in barns.
 - c) The Fair expects the exhibitors to cooperate with the AgriBusiness department, assistants, barn crews, the Fair management, and any appointed volunteers. The Fair also expects good sportsmanship, conduct and open communication.
 - d) Notify the AgriBusiness department if there is a confrontation with animal activists, or if there is someone approaching exhibitors and asking questions that make the exhibitors uneasy. Also notify the AgriBusiness department if someone who is unfamiliar or looks suspicious is taking photographs or video footage of the animals.
- 2. Livestock Exhibit Guidelines
 - a) Keep the needs of the animals as the number one priority with regard to the following:
 - Food and water are clean and fresh.
 - Stalls are clean, with fresh bedding, and free of debris and waste.
 - Animals are clean and well groomed.
 - Transportation is safe and clean. Use care when loading and unloading.
 - Stalls have enough space to prevent crowding, fighting or discomfort.



- Animals are tied in the stalls with enough slack in the rope so they may lie down.
- Use proper grooming techniques and equipment when preparing the animals for showing, to cause the least amount of discomfort to the animal.
- The management will not tolerate any practices deemed inappropriate, unethical, or inhumane. Report any sick animal immediately to the proper authority who may suggest that the exhibitor contact a veterinarian.
- b) Feed shall be appropriate for the animal's age, weight, and species. Exhibitors should read all feed labels for appropriate use and portions. Adhere to all proper withdrawal times if using medicated feeds. Follow the requirements of the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) dosages and withdrawal times of drugs, see Drug Residue Policy. The Fair prohibits any unnatural, inhumane weight control prior to weigh-in.
- c) Exhibitors should know the proper use of all equipment and exhibit safety awareness. This includes removing equipment from walkways, so it is not a hazard to people or animals. Tack areas, stalls, pens, and cages shall be neat and clean, with equipment put away in tack boxes or stored out of the way. Exhibitors shall use all equipment for approved and legal uses only.

EQUINE SHOWS AND COMPETITIONS

USDA AND APHIS (Animal and Plant Health Inspection Services), under the Horse Protection Act, which prohibits making a horse sore to enhance its performance, regulate horse shows. OSF also regulates horse shows regarding prohibited substances and the drugging of horses. USEF members and affiliated shows are subject to the rules and industry review program administered by the United States Equestrian Federation. Shows may also be subject to standards set by the individual breed associations, when and if applicable.

ANIMAL ATTRACTIONS AND EDUCATIONAL EXHIBITS

Fair management contracts and supervises animal attraction and educational exhibits. Both animal attractions and educational exhibits are required to provide educational material about their animals and their care to the public. Fair management encourages interaction with the public. This may be a criterion for issuing a contract.

Prior to opening to the public, a Fair designated veterinarian may inspect each animal exhibit. The veterinarian may also make periodic checks throughout the Fair. Each animal exhibit will designate a representative to be responsible and to be available during the Fair operating hours to answer questions, talk to the media or respond to an emergency.

- A. General guidelines for care
 - 1) Exhibit staff shall be available at all times. Signs will be posted informing the public of acceptable behavior in any petting facility.
 - 2) The staff should be familiar with basic animal husbandry practices.
 - 3) Keep animals groomed and clean at <u>all</u> times. Keep feed and water receptacles clean and free of debris. The exhibitor will clean animal stalls or pens daily. Properly dispose manure and used bedding in the appropriate receptacles or areas. Replace old bedding with fresh material.
 - 4) Alternate and give rest periods to the animals especially during hot weather. The resting pens and working area shall have shade with proper ventilation.
 - 5) Feed animals a nutritionally balanced diet as appropriate and with consideration to the animal's age, weight, and species. Water regularly when working and have clean water available in resting pens.
 - 6) The facility operator should make an effort to control flies in the exhibit and resting areas. Proper and prompt disposal of manure and used bedding is beneficial to this effort.
 - 7) Exhibitors shall use all equipment for approved and legal uses only. The management <u>will not tolerate</u> any practices deemed inappropriate, unethical, or inhumane.
 - 8) Report any sick or injured animal immediately to Fair management, who may suggest that the exhibitor contact a veterinarian.
 - 9) All animals are required to have a current, within 30 days, certificate of veterinary inspection. Many species are required to have negative tests against certain diseases. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to contact the Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food and Forestry at 405-522-6141 or <u>http://ag.ok.gov</u> to make sure all required testing has been performed.
- B. Animal Petting Facilities

The design of an animal petting facility should help educate the public about different types of animals and animal care while regarding the animals' basic needs, including time away from the public. It should also provide the rare opportunity for contact and interaction with animals. Petting zoos may feature exotic animals not typically raised on farms.



- C. Pony Rides
 - 1) The ponies should have a pad or cushioned surface such as lawn or shavings to prevent ponies from walking on the ground or asphalt for extended periods.
 - 2) The pony ride should be a safe site, away from potential, unexpected noises, and sudden movements.
 - 3) Alternate the ponies to allow for reasonable rest periods.
 - 4) Water the ponies regularly.
 - 5) Do not expose the ponies to sun for extended periods without breaks for rest, shade, and water.
 - 6) All equine are required to have a current Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (within 30 days) and a current negative Equine Infectious Anemia test (within 12 months).
- D. Pig Races
 - 1) Pig races provide fast-paced family entertainment and crowd interaction. The USDA regulates pig races and requires an exhibitor license for performing animals. Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food and Forestry requires certificates of veterinary inspection, and negative tests for brucellosis and pseudorabies for pigs to enter the state. The owner/operator of the pig races may need to produce current, and correct, copies of all CVIs and results of blood tests as requested by OSF management, or in compliance with their contract. The owner/operator of the pig races may need to produce current, and correct, copies of all licenses as regulated by the USDA. Operator should maintain itinerary or schedule of OSF dates to document past and future exhibitions. Pig races shall follow the general policies outlined in this manual, as well as the appropriate feed for the piglet's age.
- E. Other Animal Exhibits (not previously listed)
 - It is up to the exhibitor of animal attractions including: any owner exhibiting animals doing tricks or shows; carnivals and concessionaires who exhibit regulated animals; anyone who uses regulated animals to promote or advertise goods and services; animals used to promote photographs or photography; and anyone exhibiting farm animals for nonagricultural purposes to have knowledge of and obtain in a timely manner any required licenses.

ANIMAL CARE POLICY DISCIPLINE AND VIOLATION NOTICE

- A. Fair Management relies on staff members, volunteers, exhibitors, and the public to report any situations that may be potential policy violations.
- B. Fair Management will investigate and determine the severity of all complaints and concerns.
- C. If there is a violation of the Animal Welfare Policy, the exhibitor will receive a verbal warning and the steps needed to correct the violation.
- D. With a second violation, the exhibitor will receive a written violation notice and Fair Management may call the Humane Society or veterinarian, at the exhibitor's expense, depending on the severity of the violation. The removal of animals and/or exhibitor from OKCF may become necessary.
- E. A record of the verbal violation warning, and copies of the violation notices will become part of the exhibitor's file. Fair Management will consider these before issuing another contract.
- F. Any other public or staff complaint filed will become part of the exhibitor's file. Exhibitor will receive copies.
- G. Fair Management reserves the right to disqualify any competitive exhibitors in violation of the animal care policy from any awards and premiums.

HEALTH & SANITARY REGULATIONS (updated 5/30/23)

OVERVIEW

- 1. The State Board of Agriculture provided the following rules and regulations to the Fair. These rules will govern admission of livestock at the OSF.
- 2. An official of the Animal Industry Division, Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food and Forestry, will be present during livestock entry times and will check all Certificates of Veterinary Inspection required under the following regulations.
- 3. The Animal Industry Division, Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food and Forestry, must validate all Certificates of Veterinary Inspection before animals are given stall or pen space in the barns.
- 4. An official Certificate of Veterinary Inspection must accompany all show animals. The official CVI must be issued within 30 days of arrival and shall be available at all times to the representatives of the Animal Industry Division. All out-of-state livestock, including domesticated poultry, birds and rabbits must meet Oklahoma's import requirements. Import requirements may be obtained by going to www.ag.ok.gov/Divisions/Animal Industry State Veterinarian and scrolling down to the link to the Animal Movement and Importation section.
- 5. All animals must be free of infectious, communicable, or contagious disease and if such disease is found, it will be cause for removal of the animal(s) from exhibition.

CATTLE

- Cattle must be accompanied by an official CVI, issued within 30 days of arrival that shows complete description of livestock as to age, sex, breed, and individual identification, such as tattoo or ear tag. It also must show the animals are free of external parasites, ringworm, warts and any infectious, contagious, or communicable disease. Cattle from out-of-state are required to have an official USDA identification tag as required by the Federal Animal Disease Traceability rule.
- 2. No tuberculosis (TB) test is required for beef or dairy cattle from Oklahoma.
 - <u>Out-of-state beef breeds</u>: Must originate from a TB free state, a TB Accredited Free Herd or must be TB test
 negative within 60 days of arrival at the show if over 6 months of age.
 - Areas not Tuberculosis Free as of June 1, 2022 are the Michigan counties of Montmorency, Alpena, Oscoda, and Alcona.
 - <u>Out-of-state dairy breeds</u>: Must originate from a TB free state, a TB Accredited Free Herd or must be TB test negative within 60 days of arrival at the show if over 6 months of age.
 - Areas not Tuberculosis Free as of June 1, 2022 are the Michigan counties of Montmorency, Alpena, Oscoda, and Alcona.
 - Any sexually intact dairy animal 6 months of age or older changing ownership within the state of Oklahoma is
 required to have a negative TB test within 60 days before change of ownership. If you have any questions or
 concerns you may call the Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food, and Forestry Animal Industry Services
 at 405-522-6141 for definite regulations.

SHEEP and GOATS

- 1. Must be accompanied by an official Certificate of Veterinary Inspection. The CVI must show the animal to be free of any infectious, contagious, or communicable disease, and include a statement indicating the animal to have been inspected and found free of scabies and other external parasites. All sheep and goats must be individually identified with one of the following:
 - Official USDA ear tag
 - Official breed registry tattoo or microchip, (only if animal is accompanied by a registration certificate).

ILLEGIBLE TATTOOS WILL BE CONSIDERED AS NO IDENTIFICATION.



SWINE

- Must be accompanied by an official Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) processed and issued within 30 days of the date of arrival at OSF, that shows <u>official</u> individual identification by an <u>840 electronic tag</u>, complete description of livestock as to age, sex, breed, and also that they are free of external parasites, ringworms, or warts, or any infectious, contagious, or communicable disease. <u>All swine must have a premises ID listed on</u> <u>the CVI.</u>
- In-state swine must have a negative test for Brucellosis and Pseudorabies after May 15, 2023 or be from a Validated Brucellosis/Qualified Pseudorabies Free Herd and be exhibited by the owners and/or immediate family members. The last quarterly test date (July test) must be listed on the CVI.
 - <u>Breeding gilts</u> should be quarantined and retested 30 days after the show before being commingled with other breeding swine.
 - <u>Out-of-state swine</u> must have a CVI, an entry permit, proof of negative test for Brucellosis and Pseudorabies <u>within 30 days of entry to the fair</u> or be from a Validated/Qualified Herd <u>with verification of the last quarterly test within 3 months and</u> be identified with an official individual USDA Ear Tag.

DOGS

- 1. Must be accompanied by an official Certificate of Veterinary Inspection.
- 2. All dogs over 3 months of age must have been officially vaccinated against rabies within 12 months of arrival. <u>All dogs must have been vaccinated against distemper, hepatitis, leptospirosis, and parvovirus within the previous 12 months.</u>

LLAMAS and ALPACAS

1. Each animal must be accompanied by an individual Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI), stating that the animal is free of infections and contagious disease within 30 days before arrival at the show.

EQUINE

All horses and other equine must be accompanied by a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection or valid <u>Extended Equine</u> <u>Certificate of Veterinary inspection</u> showing age, breed, sex, and markings to positively identify the animals, including all vaccinations, date and result of required tests, and issued within 30 days of arrival and an official document verifying a negative test for Equine Infectious Anemia showing a test date within 12 months prior to exhibition. Nursing foals less than 6 months of age, accompanied by their negative tested and documented dams, are exempt from test requirements. The laboratory conducting the test must be approved by APHIS, USDA. Both aforementioned documents must clearly identify the animal(s) listed and be presented upon arrival before the animals can be admitted to the grounds or unloaded from the transport vehicles. Any horse/pony/equine arriving without the above-defined documentation will not be allowed entrance onto the grounds or into the barns.

SHOW RING CODE OF ETHICS

Believing it is in the best interest of all livestock breeders to maintain a reputation of integrity and to continue to present a wholesome and progressive image in the show ring, the following list of practices are considered unacceptable in the presentation of livestock. The use of such practices or procedures is, therefore, considered a violation of the rules and regulations governing the OSF.

The following list of practices are considered unacceptable in the presentation of livestock:

- 1. Misrepresenting the age of the animal for the class in which it is shown.
- 2. Treating or massaging any part of the body internally or externally with an irritant, counter-irritant or other substance to temporarily straighten a weak back or loin or to produce unnatural animation.
- 3. Minimizing the effects of crampiness by feeding or injecting drugs, depressants or applying packs, or using any artificial contrivance or therapeutic treatment exempting normal exercise.
- 4. Striking the animal to cause swelling.
- 5. Surgery or other procedure performed to change the natural process of growth, maturation, contour, or appearance of any animal, to include teeth, is prohibited. Not included is removal of teats or horns, clipping and dressing of hair, and trimming of hooves.
- 6. Insertion of foreign material under the skin.
- 7. Any attempt to change natural color of an animal, either purebred or crossbred, by changing the color or adding false hair, fleece or skin at any point, spot, or area of the animal's body.
- 8. The use of alcoholic beverages in the feed or administered as a drench.
- 9. The practice of artificial filling by pumping or any other device is prohibited.
- 10. Administration of a drug, of any kind or description, internally or externally, prior to entering the show ring, except for treating a recognized disease or injury and for tranquilizing bulls that may otherwise be dangerous or females in heat. For the purpose of these rules, the term "legal drug" shall mean any substance, the sale, possession or use of which is controlled by license under federal, state, or local laws or regulations and any substance commonly used by the medical or veterinary professions. The use of any chemical and/or compound that is not approved by the FDA for use in meat producing animals and the illegal use of approved chemicals and/or compounds are prohibited. All animals shall be subject to tests for foreign substances that exceed the acceptable levels established by the USDA, FDA, or EPA. A positive test will result in disqualification, forfeiture of any premiums and/or awards, and will exclude the exhibitor from future competition at the OSF. Licensed veterinarians will administer all medications only.
- 11. Balancing the udder by any abnormal means including the use of a mechanical contrivance or injection of fluid or drugs. Setting the teats and/or occluding, sealing the ends, with a mechanical contrivance or with the use of a chemical preparation. Treating or massaging the udder or its attachments with an irritant or counterirritant. The use of common products such as fly spray, ointment, or liniment in excess to the extent that it is irritating is included as an irritant unless required to reduce edema at the time of calving.
- 12. Criticizing or interfering with the judge, or other exhibitors, breed representatives or show officials before, during or after the event may result in an individual or group being expelled, placed on probation, declared ineligible, or barred from exhibiting at the event.

Any violation of the rules and regulations designed for the individual shows or the show ring code of ethics may result in forfeiture of all premiums and awards, disqualification, expulsion or probation of the exhibitor, organized group, individual or livestock involved. Probation, disqualification, expulsion, or other disciplinary action of OSF management will be final. Such action will require application for readmission under such terms as OSF management may prescribe before the group or individual is allowed to exhibit at future events.

The OSF is a member of the following show support organizations: North American Livestock Show and Rodeo Managers Association; and International Association of Fairs and Expositions. Violations at this show may affect the eligibility of the individual, group or sponsoring organization from participation at other shows that are also members of these organizations. The names of anyone in violation will be released to the other Fairs and Expositions.

- 1. Heifers born on or after September 1, 2021 and Bulls born on or after January 1, 2022 will be allowed to show in junior shows. Bulls one year or older must be shown with nose ring or nose restraint with lead attached.
- 2. The American Angus Association (hereinafter referred to as AAA) may contribute to premium support offered in individual classes for junior Angus heifers according to number of head shown in the previous year. The premium assistance shall be included in the premium payments distributed by the Oklahoma State Fair to the exhibitors.
- 3. A minimum of 15 head must be shown in the junior Angus heifer classes to be potentially eligible for the AAA to assist with premium support. The show is not required to have all classes to be eligible for premiums.
- 4. Separate classes for bred and owned heifers may be held if the size of the show merits a separate class.
- 5. To be eligible for AAA premium support, the entries must be recorded in the sole name of the junior exhibitor and the issue date on the registration certificate must conform to the individual show's requirements regarding ownership. Any contribution by the AAA for premium support will be included in the total premiums listed in each class and paid by the Oklahoma State Fair.
- 6. Premiums from the AAA are paid only to the recorded owner(s) of registered Angus cattle and only if the registration number is a part of the show report provided to the AAA. Therefore, all cattle should be registered at the time of entry to make certain they are eligible for the Association's portion of the premiums. The AAA does not contribute to premiums for championship classes. The AAA will only count an animal one time toward the total count for possible premium support.
- 7. Exhibitors must have the original registration certificate on each animal available for inspection at the show. Electronically stored registration certificates are <u>NOT</u> accepted – only the original certificates issued by the American Angus Association. Any animal, upon check-in, that does not have a legible, permanent identification mark (ear tattoo marks, freeze-branded marks or hot-branded marks or hot-branded marks) corresponding to the permanent identification mark on the registration certificate, is ineligible to show. Animals must be exhibited in individual classes. - 1. Animals must be registered in the American Brahman Breeders' Association (ABBA) to be eligible to compete in association-sponsored shows. The registration certificates for each entry must be available for presentation to the superintendent or manager of the show at the time entries are verified prior to judging.
- The registration number and animal identification number (number branded on animal) of each animal must be entered in an individual class, the sire of each get-of-sire and the dam of each produce-of-dam entry must be listed on the entry card of each animal entered.
- 3. Entries that have not complied with rule 1 and rule 2 will not be eligible to show, receive premium monies or earn points in the Association's register of renown.
- 4. Animals eligible to be shown in group classes must be entered and shown in individual classes.
- Entries will be listed numerically according to age, oldest first, in catalogs and judging schedules. <u>Include animal</u> <u>identification number (number brand) as a part of identification.</u> When entering the arena for judging, the handlers will line up cattle numerically.
- 6. Judges will be allowed to comment on placings in selected classes when conditions permit.
- 7. Each animal will be presented in the show ring in its natural conformation and structure without alteration or modification. Alteration or modification shall be defined to include any surgical or circulatory constriction including banding or other appearance change, save only branding, tattooing, foot trimming or dehorning. Injections of foreign substances for cosmetic purposes shall be prohibited. If to the satisfaction of the ABBA's staff, officers, executive committee, or board of directors any animal has had its natural conformation and structure altered; then said animal shall be ruled ineligible to compete until such time the executive committee and owner(s) have reviewed the case.
- 8. In cases where families, companies, corporations, etc., are operated as a unit under the same management, but also have cattle registered in the name of the individual partners, said cattle, even though bearing a different ownership brand, are eligible to be shown in competition under the firm name provided they have not been, and will not be, shown in the name of the individuals.
- 9. For females being shown in the three oldest classes (*females calved September 1, 2020 August 31, 2021), the exhibitor must have a certificate of pregnancy issued by a licensed veterinarian to be presented to show officials at



time of check-in or registration paper check. The show reserves the right to perform pregnancy determination by palpation for females in the above classes at any given ABBA approved show if an official protest has been filed. Females exhibited in the last class <u>MUST</u> have a calf at side. The only exemption from this rule will be cows that have already weaned a calf and a registration certificate of the calf <u>MUST</u> be presented to the judge.

- 10. All bulls will be shown with a nose ring or nose restraint with lead attached. For bulls being shown in the oldest class, the exhibitor must have a certificate issued by a licensed veterinarian stating the bull has produced viable semen. The certificate must be available for inspection by the judge on request.
- 11. This deals with the produce of dam classes and the get-of-sire class:
 - a. Embryo produce of dam: Two (2) animals from the above classes produced by one (1) dam by embryo transfer, either or both sexes may be represented. No ownership required.
 - b. Natural produce of dam: Two (2) natural born animals produced by one (1) dam from the above classes, either or both sexes may be represented. No ownership required.
 - c. Get-of-Sire: Four (4) animals from at least two (2) dams by one sire from the above individual classes, both sexes represented. No ownership required.
- 12. No exhibitor shall be permitted to show more than one (1) produce or embryo-produce of dam per dam.
- 13. Cows that are exhibited with calves at side must be in a lactating stage. Calves must be shown and exhibited with their dams and said calves must not exceed 240 days of age on day of judging. The ring steward will inform the judge which cows whose calves are ineligible to show by this rule.
- 14. Cattle will not be allowed to show if their switches have been balled or glitter applied to their skin.
- 15. The intent of the ABBA in shows that exhibit a large number of cattle is to divide the cattle into separate red and grey divisions.
 - a. If so, the following procedure will apply. All grey cattle and solid black cattle will show grey. Red, black, and white speckled or red and white speckled cattle will show red. Cattle with questionable color pigmentation may be entered in the color division the breeder selects, however, said cattle are subject to inspection by a three (3) member ABBA committee. If the color commit/tee disagrees with the breeder, the pedigree and color of said animal will then be used to aid in the final determination. In those cases where questionable colored cattle possess both red and grey breeding, then the color committee will make the final determination. The decision of the color committee is final.
 - b. Once animals have been classified, they will remain in that classification unless they were young at the time of classification and it is apparent that they have changed their color.
 - c. In the get-of-sire and produce-of-dam classes, breeders will not be allowed to show cattle of mixed color. They will be entered as to the color division they are assigned by the color committee.
 - d. At split shows where the color committee is not present, a staff member with two (2) ABBA directors will clarify questionable colored cattle for that particular show. The color committee will do the final classification.
- 18. The owner on record of any registered animal entered in an ABBA approved show and/or his/her agent, exhibitor, fitter, handler and/or representative releases ABBA and its representatives from any and all liability that the seller/owner might claim as a result of injury of any kind sustained before, during or after handling cattle for any ABBA board approved activity.
- 19. For shows to remain approved point shows by ABBA, they must maintain a 40 head average for the previous two (2) years.
- 20. The official ABBA rules and procedures governing showing and exhibiting of registered Brahman cattle supersede any rules printed in any show catalog.
- 21. In an attempt to ensure that all animals receive an equal evaluation at the national and international shows, classes with more than 30 entries, may at the discretion of the show management and/or ABBA officials be split by age as evenly as possible.

ADDITIONAL RULES

Eligibility

- 1. Animals must be registered Brangus, Red Brangus, UltraBlack or UltraRed with the International Brangus Breeders Association (IBBA) to be eligible to compete. Animals recorded in the IBBA appendix registry are ineligible to show.
- 2. UltraBlacks and UltraReds must show separately from Brangus and Red Brangus, with the exception of calves shown at the side of their dams in both the Female and Cow Calf show. The registration prefix of the dam determines the classification of the pair.
- 3. All calves exhibited at the side of the female must be registered with the IBBA and meet all rules required for show eligibility and inspections of exhibits (refer to Rule 9.a). The registration prefix of the dam determines the classification of the pair.
- 4. Animals eligible to be shown in group classes must be entered and shown in respective individual classes. Cows exhibited in the cow/calf classes are not eligible for the group classes. *Cows exhibited in the cow/calf classes are not eligible for the group classes.

Animal Identification

- The registration certificate (or photocopy) for each entry must be available for presentation to the Superintendent or show manager at the time entries are verified prior to judging. Digital images and herd book data sheets will not be accepted.
- 6. Any animal upon check in which does not have a legible tattoo or brand corresponding to its registration certificate is ineligible to show. An animal may be tattooed immediately at a show for reinspection.

Physical Inspection and Eligibility

- 7. Prior to check-in, heads of exhibited animals must be clipped of all hair, including topknots and be free of scurs and/or slick spots. Animals not in compliance at check in will be required to comply before check-in is complete, or they will not be allowed to show.
- 8. Any animal found to have scurs and/or slick spots; or evidence of incisions, surgical or otherwise, in the following areas: head, testicles, sheath, navel, or dewlap; including scars from caesarean sections, will be disqualified from showing. They shall be disqualified at the show where the violation is determined and all future IBBA sponsored and sanctioned shows. A veterinary statement of purpose or cause will not be accepted.



- 9. Animals with illegal white (defined as white in front of the naval) or any indication of brindling (a color pattern characterized by red streaks mingled with black), or red animals with any unacceptable coloring (according to the IBBA Red High Color Scale available at gobrangus.com and including Brown, Grey, Yellow, Light to White, White Legs or Black Muzzle) are ineligible for show at the show in which the color issue is found. The animals are eligible for inspection at future shows.
- 10. No animal may be shown that has been pumped with any amount of liquid at any time once the animal enters the grounds of a show. The official show veterinarian may administer liquids orally, if so needed, without disqualifying animal(s) from exhibition. (a) A protest of this violation must be submitted per the Violation Policy (b) Penalty: The fitter and ranch entity involved with an animal being artificially filled with be banned from the show ring for one year and the animal will be disqualified from exhibition at that particular show.

Fitting and Presentation

- 11. Animals unethically fitted to alter the conformation or appearance of the animal, as determined by show superintendent(s) and show management, will be immediately disqualified at the show in which the violation occurred. This includes (a) No animal may be shown that has had any foreign objects, glued to, or otherwise attached in a manner so as to alter its conformation or change its appearance. (b) Paint or coloring agents of any kind are not to be used on any animal exhibited.
- 12. All bulls must have a nose ring or nose restraint with the lead attached at all times, with the exception of being tied in the stalls and tie outs. This includes but is not limited to being in the show ring and during check in. Bulls 250 days and younger are exempt from this requirement.

Fertility and Performance Requirements

- 13. All Brangus bulls 18 months of age or older that are exhibited at IBBA sponsored shows must have passed a fertility examination given by a non-owner licensed veterinarian or a non-owner certified technician to the standards of the Society of Theriology to be eligible to show. The results of the examination must be available at check-in. Once a bull has a positive examination, retesting is not required.
- 14. All females 20 months of age or older exhibited at IBBA sanctioned shows, must have available at the time of checkin, a certificate of pregnancy issued by an accredited non-owner veterinarian, non-owner certified professional or blood test results certificate. If a blood tests results certificate is provided, it must be blood collected by a non-owner veterinarian or non-owner certified professional and documented. If the female is open due to being in an embryo transfer program, a certified copy of the flush record showing viable embryos produced by the said female must be presented at check-in, by a non-owner embryologist. If verification cannot be produced, the female will be allowed to participate if the exhibitor can produce a qualified veterinarian to examine the female at the show site and verify pregnancy. Females showing in the Senior Heifer Division of Springs Shows (January 1 through May 31) must adhere to the classifications and have an IBBA registered natural calf, not older than 250 days of age on show date.
- 15. Produce of Dam: Two animals out of the same dam; can be both sexes by different bulls.
- 16. Junior Get of Sire: Three head, both sexes by one sire; must be senior calves and younger.
- 17. Senior Get of Sire: Four head, both sexes by one sire; can be any age in current classifications.
- 18. **Breeders Herd**: Four head; both sexes do not have to be represented; must be bred and owned or bred and coowned by exhibitor.

Breeding cattle shows will be NO FIT, meaning blow and show only. No paint or glue allowed.



- 1. All exhibitors are subject to the rules and regulations of the Oklahoma State Fair and the American Maine-Anjou Association (AMAA). Any person found guilty of misrepresentation or not abiding by the show rules will be disqualified from showing.
- 2. The Maine-Anjou division is open to cattle recorded in the herd book of the Maine-Anjou Association, 204 Marshall Road, Platte City, MO 64079-1100.
- 3. All animals must be registered in the AMAA and the original certificate must be inspected before the show.
- 4. All animals must be 25% to 58% Maine-Anjou or greater.
- 5. Tattoos will be checked, must be legible, and correspond with the registration certificate.
- 6. The surgical or non-surgical alteration or conformation of an animal is prohibited, except for dehorning. Cattle are to be shown in their natural conformation.
- 7. The use of false tail heads or adding hair, or other material to any part of the animal's body is prohibited.
- 8. The dyeing or artificial changing of the overall natural color of any animal is prohibited. Coloring agents may be used on the legs and tail switches, but none may be used above the flank.
- 9. All animals must be dehorned.
- 10. All cattle shall be made available for veterinary examination to determine the presence of altering. Cattle will also be made available for a veterinary examination and be mouthed for the purpose of age verification. Those cattle found to be questionable in the opinion of the veterinarian, may be removed from the show or moved to a different class at the discretion of the show committee.
- 11. Exhibitors of heifers 20 months of age or older must have a certificate of pregnancy issued by a licensed veterinarian available for inspection. A copy of the registration papers showing all ownership of animal must accompany an entry of each animal.
- 12. Cow/calf class (class #19): Cows that are exhibited with calves at side must be in lactating stage. Calves must not exceed 240 days of age on the day of judging and must be nursing. Calf entries in the cow/calf classes may be shown individually providing individual entry has been made. Cows may be evaluated and screened out of the show on the basis of an unsound utter. The determination of the show committee will be final. The Champion Cow/Calf Pair will be eligible for the Female Championship.



- 13. Bulls exhibited at 20 months of age or older must have had a positive semen test, and a certificate to that effect must be available for inspection.
- 14. Bulls six months of age or older shall be shown with a bull lead in place.
- 15. At the discretion of the superintendent, classes may be split if entries warrant.

- 1. **Pre-Juniors can participate in the Junior show.** Participants under the age of 8 may show if they have reached their 3rd birthday by September 22, 2023.
- 2. Participants must NOT have reached their 22nd birthday by September 22, 2023.
- 3. Pre-Junior Show Exhibitors (3–7-year-old) may have one person to assist with exhibiting their animal. An assistant may be a parent, sibling, or another junior exhibitor: *8 years of age or older*. The exhibitors are to handle the showing. One show stick per animal allowed and the use of the show stick is only to be done by the actual exhibitor. Adult (or assistant) role is for safety reasons only and said assistant is not allowed to assist with setting up or exhibition of the animal. (i.e., the assistant cannot take control of the show stick/halter to set up the animal). The pre-junior exhibitor must be attentive to their animal at all times. Excessive coaching, assisting or verbal communication between assistant and exhibitor is not allowed and may be penalized.
- 4. Any pre-junior (ages 3-7 years old) showing a bull <u>MUST</u> have an adult assistant accompany them in the show ring and follow guidelines noted above.
- 5. Bulls born on or after September 1, 2020 will be allowed to show in <u>this</u> junior show. Bulls one year and older must be shown with nose ring or nose restraint with lead attached.
- 6. All animals must have legible tattoos that correspond exactly to their registration papers.
- 7. Registration papers must show that the animal was owned or transferred to the exhibitor prior to July 1 of the current year. All exhibitors must have registration papers in their name.
- 8. Registration papers from the breed association that are in order are acceptable. Copies, telegrams, or phone calls are not acceptable. These will be required upon check-in.
- Entries must be registered with the American Hereford Association (AHA) and out of an actively registered sire and dam. Animals with "pending" or "applied for" registrations are not eligible to show and cannot be entered as such. Registrations must be recorded with AHA at the time of entry and must be on record at the time of the show.
- 10. Entries are subject to provisions and rules for showing as set forth by the AHA board of directors and are subject to supervision of the show officials.

- 1. Only registered Red Angus cattle in Category 1A (100%) and Category 1B (87% through 99%) will be eligible to show. This specifically excludes cattle in Category II and III. The Oklahoma State Fair (OSF) Red Angus Show will be conducted under a joint show provision wherein Category 1A and 1B show together in the same classes.
- 2. All animals entered must conform to all the OSF and Red Angus Association of America (RAAA) eligibility requirements.
- 3. Red Angus cattle must be officially registered in one of the following: RAAA Herdbook, Canadian Angus Association Herdbook or any foreign Angus Association Herdbook recognized by the RAAA and have official registration papers available for inspection by show officials at OSF.
- 4. Animals entered must have been registered in the name of the person entering no less than 30 days prior to the show.
- 5. Entries in classes at any Red Angus show are accepted with the understanding that each exhibitor agrees to conform to the rules and regulations of the RAAA with reference to inspection of entries, such as blood typing, mouthing and such other inspections prescribed by the RAAA.
- 6. All animals must be properly tattooed and will be inspected at the show. Tattoos must be legible and must match the registration certificate. If an animal's tattoo is not legible or does not match the registration certificate and cannot be read during processing, it will not be allowed to participate in the show.
- 7. Each exhibitor and/or owner of Red Angus cattle entered in any Red Angus show or exhibition is required to ensure that each animal will be exhibited in its natural conformation and structure and without any alterations or modifications, with the exception of acceptable fitting, grooming and treatment of hooves.
- 8. The addition of any hair or hair-like substances shall be considered an unethical practice and will not be allowed in Red Angus competition.
- 9. All females, 20 months of age or older on date of show, exhibited at a show sponsored by the RAAA must be accompanied by a certificate of pregnancy from a licensed veterinarian or have produced fertile eggs as certified in a written statement by a licensed veterinarian or embryologist or have a calf at side. Failure to show documentation will result in the animal being ineligible to show.



- 10. All bulls, 9 months of age or older on date of show, exhibited at a show sponsored by the RAAA must be shown with a nose lead.
- 11. Each exhibitor and/or owner of Red Angus entering in any Red Angus show or exhibition is subject to the "Declaration of Participation" in accordance with the RAAA rules and regulations.

- 1. Exhibitors must be Oklahoma Junior Red Angus members in good standing.
- All animals entered must conform to all show and Association eligibility requirements <u>AND EMAIL A</u> <u>PHOTOGRAPH OF THE ENTERED PERCENTAGE RED ANGUS FEMALE TO SEAN OR DANEA ISON</u> (sison711989@yahoo.com) AT TIME OF ENTRY.
- 3. Entries in classes at any Red Angus show are accepted with the understanding that each exhibitor agrees to conform to the rules and regulations of the Red Angus Association of America with reference to inspection of:
 - a. Entries, such as blood typing, mouthing and such other inspections prescribed by the Red Angus Association of America.
 - b. All animals must be properly tattooed and will be inspected at the show. Tattoos must be legible and must match the registration certificate.
- 4. If an animal's tattoo is not legible or does not match the registration certificate and cannot be read during processing, it will not be allowed to participate in the show.
- 5. Each exhibitor and/or owner of Red Angus cattle entered in any Red Angus show or exhibition is required to ensure that each animal will be exhibited in its natural conformation and structure and without any alterations or modifications except for the treatment of hooves.
- 6. The addition of any hair or hair-like substances shall be considered an unethical practice and will not be allowed in Red Angus competition.
- 7. All females 20 months of age or older (on announced date of show) exhibited at a show sponsored by the Red Angus Association of America must be accompanied by a certificate of pregnancy from a licensed veterinarian or have produces fertile eggs as certified in a written statement by a licensed veterinarian or embryologist or have a calf at side. Failure to show documentation will result in the animal being ineligible to show.
- 8. Ownership Requirements: All animals must be registered in the exhibitor's name only.
- a. No partnership or ranch owned animal will be allowed to show.
- 9. Females must be registered with RAAA as a Category 2 or 3.
- 10. Females must be no less than 50 percent Red Angus.



- 11. The sire or the dam must be a registered Category 1A or 1B Red Angus with the RAAA. Must be red hided and predominately red (**NO BLACK HIDED OR BLACK ANIMALS**, refer to the RAAA Breeder's Guide for disqualifying characteristics).
- 12. A scurred animal is considered polled if you choose not to remove the scurs, if you surgically or mechanically remove the scur you will be disqualified.
- 13. All females must meet the age requirements of Oklahoma State Fair, Champion Red Angus Percentage Female and Reserve Champion Red Angus Percentage Female

- 3. Exhibitors must have the original registration certificate on each animal available for inspection at the show. Electronically stored registration certificates are NOT accepted only the original certificates.
- 4. Heifers may be entered in the open show by entering and paying the applicable entry fees (see Division 1026).
- 5. The heifer must be registered in the name of the junior exhibitor prior to July 1 of the current year.
- 6. Any animal with a pending or applied for registration or without a legible tattoo will not be eligible for show competition.
- 7. All entries are subject to provisions and rules for showing as set forth by the SGBI.
- 8. BRED AND OWNED CLASSES (class #20 & 35): Pre-entry required by stated deadlines. Exhibitor must be listed as sole breeder and owner on original registration certificate to be eligible. ADDITIONAL RULES

- All exhibits of Santa Gertrudis breeding cattle must be registered meeting the requirements for registration as outlined in the Santa Gertrudis rules and regulations for registration and shall be governed by the last revised version of the <u>rules and regulations for approved Santa Gertrudis open and junior shows</u> as approved by SGBI, P.O. Box 1257, Kingsville, TX 78364. A copy may be obtained by contacting the association or viewed at <u>www.santagertrudis.com</u>
- 2. Each owner must be a bona fide member of SGBI. This means the active or junior member has paid all current dues and fees with no outstanding balances on their accounts.
- 3. ALL animals accepted for exhibition in an SGBI sanctioned show are subject to inspection at each show between arrival on grounds and prior to entering the show ring. The inspection will be conducted by a committee comprised of two (2) members of the shows and exhibits committee and one (1) from the breed standards committee.
- 4. Juniors showing in open shows is allowed and encouraged. Entry must be shown by the owner or immediate family member (sister, brother, mother, father, grandparents, legal guardian). No animal may be fitted or shown by any open exhibitor at any time during the junior's ownership period. An exception is transportation feed and care to a show may be allowed. Refer to junior ownership rules. Heifers twenty-four (24) months of age or older must be safe in calf as verified by a graduate veterinarian or have

produced a live, Santa Gertrudis sired calf with that calf at side meeting the Standard of Excellence and the calf must be registered by thirty (30) days of age. If the animal is open due to being an embryo transfer program this fact must be verified by a written statement signed by a licensed embryo technician in order to show. All bulls 18 months of age or older must provide a passing BSE test.

- 5. All bulls eleven (11) months of age and older must be exhibited with a nose ring.
- 6. All animals must be registered or recorded and PERMANENTLY identified before the show with a brand ID or an ear tattoo.
- 7. Fitting:
 - *a.* Purebred fitting All purebred animals must be exhibited with the hair brushed down on the entire body, legs, and tail with no foreign objects attached to the animal in a manner as to alter the animal's



conformation or change its appearance. <u>*Exhibitors failing to abide by this rule will not be allowed to</u> <u>show.</u>

- 1. Specifically, all hair must be brushed down slick; head clipped smooth; underline clipped blending sides; udder and teats clipped with no long hair to emphasize udder; ears clipped as to environmental and local standards; neck and brisket clipped; body clip using common sense as to season; leg hair clipped and do not leave long from hock or knee to hoof; tail head clipped; pull switch or brush out (no ball, etc.) trim tail to personal preference. Fitting handbook should be studied.
- b. Star Five fitting Star Five exhibits are not subject to purebred clipping rules. Entries are to be fitted. Hair may be brushed according to preference with no paint or adhesives on any part of the body.
- 8. Each animal must be exhibited with the correct age and shown in the class corresponding with their correct age. SGBI reserves the right to tooth animals without prior notice to the breeders in order to verify age of cattle.
- 9. Entries in each class will be placed 1, 2, 3, etc. Animals are to be presented in descending order according to age.
- 10. Polled classes will be entered at the same time as class entries are required by each show. Animals will be lined up according to age for the judge.
- 11. To be eligible to show in Best of Polled, animals must be slick polled with no scurs, no scars, no dehorning and with no evidence of horny tissue.
- 12. Classes with more than thirty (30) entries should be divided into heats and heat winners return for final placing.
- 13. The judge should be an SGBI approved judge.
- 14. Dress for exhibitors participating in SGBI sanctioned Open and Junior shows shall be of neat and clean clothing of collared shirts with sleeves, belts, no midriffs showing and appropriate footwear no tennis shoes. Exhibitors may wear hats or go bareheaded no caps.
- 15. Each animal shall be presented in the show ring in its natural conformation and structure without alteration or modification. Alteration or modification shall be defined to include any surgical, chemical, electrical, pharmaceutical, or other appearance change, save only branding, tattooing, foot trimming, or dehorning. Additionally, no pumping or filling of an animal with a liquid, diuretic or any other substance is allowed. ALL animals and exhibitors found to be in violation of this rule will be banned for life from showing at SGBI approved shows.
- 16. If entries are not properly fitted and good herdsmanship followed, the owner may be asked to not display their cattle until adhering to the proper procedures as outlined in our herdsmanship paper.
- 17. Every exhibitor, in consideration of their entry being accepted, agrees to submit any animal so entered by them to inspection and agrees to have such animal submitted to any tests as may be designated and requested by the shows and exhibits committee, or the authorized representatives of the relevant show or fair, and agrees that the conclusions reached by the committee/representative as to whether such animal is unethically fitted or over age, shall be final, without recourse, against SGBI and designated personnel. Any false representation, interference, or unprofessional conduct on the part of any exhibitor will be dealt with by the shows and exhibits committee according to the equities of the case.
- 18. Any person who furnished the birthday of the animal to SGBI either on the International Purebred Registration Application of some other document (whereby that birthday information is transferred to the registration certificate) and that animal is exhibited in an SGBI approved show with an incorrect age and the age determined by the designated veterinarian exceeds the age listed on the registration certificate by more than 30 days, the person furnishing the birthday above and such person furnishing said information to SGBI for inclusion on the registration certification shall be barred from showing in a SGBI approved show for a period of six (6) months for the first offense, one (1) year for the second offense and for life for the third offense. However, the animal, if transferred to another owner, may be placed in the correct class and be shown again.
- 19. For and in consideration of the opportunity to participate in any SGBI approved show, each exhibitor hereby releases SGBI, its officers, directors and representatives from negligence, and all claims, suits, and judgments, either past, present, or future, arising from or connected with the administration or use of such test or examination and the resulting decision therefrom.
- 20. Any exhibitor desiring to dispute or challenge the results of any test, exam, or show rule enforcement, as applied to his/her animals, shall do so in accordance with procedures established by the rules of the association.
- 21. APPEALS:
 - a. The Chairman of the Shows and Exhibits Committee and the Vice-President of Youth Activities in conjunction with the person(s) responsible for coordinating the individual show(s) will continue to be primarily vested with authority to determine whether animals entered in shows meet the standards formally approved by the Breed Standards Committee.



- b. In the event the Vice-President of Youth Activities or individual show coordinating official disqualifies an animal from participating in a show and the exhibitor wants to appeal the disqualification, the appeal process outlined below must be followed.
- c. In the event the Chairman of Shows and Exhibits or individual show coordinating official disqualifies an animal from participating in a sanctioned show, and the exhibitor wants to appeal the disqualification, the appeal process outlined below must be followed.
- d. Additionally, any exhibitor participating in an individual show or other SGBI sanctioned show that wants to appeal a breed standards disqualification decision by either the Vice-President for Youth Activities/youth show coordinating official or the Chairman of Shows and Exhibits/show coordinating official must follow the appeals process outlined below.
- 22. PROCEDURES TO FILE A PROTEST:
 - a. File protest with show that infraction occurred. Follow their protest rules.
 - b. File the same protest with the shows and exhibits committee. Contact the chairman.
 - c. Three (3) SGBI members in good standing must sign the protest.
 - d. All protests must be in writing and accompanied by a deposit of \$100, cash or certified check, which will be forfeited if protest is not sustained. Such protest must state plainly the cause of the complaint or appeal and must be delivered to the shows and exhibits committee within 24 hours after the occasion for such protests.
 - e. Order of hearing a protest:
 - 1. Chairman of shows and exhibits committee
 - 2. Action by shows and exhibits committee
 - 3. Final action by board of directors
 - 4. Follow appeal procedure as outlined in the rules and regulations
 - f. All rules and regulations that have been properly protested to the shows and exhibits committee shall be subject to the following penalties:
 - 1. Loss of premium money
 - 2. Loss of awards
 - 3. Suspension from showing that animal as deemed necessary. Penalty may be for one to three shows, or as long as deemed necessary for the offense.
 - 4. Suspension of the exhibitor being the same as other SGBI rules penalties.
- 28. Failure to adhere to each show's specific rules shall also be subject to these penalties. Proper protest procedures must be adhered to according to that particular show rules. SGBI will follow each show's rules and any action taken by a show will be upheld by SGBI in relation to its bearing on our point show system.
- 29. Disqualifications:
 - a. An exhibitor who has been disqualified from competition in any livestock show or has had a premium withheld or withdrawn on the grounds of rule violation(s) will not be allowed to compete in other shows. This shall include, but is not limited to, disqualification for fraud, misrepresentation, unethical fitting, or deception.
 - b. Judging procedures will NOT be interrupted for protest investigation. Depending on the basis of the protest, a decision may be withheld until a thorough investigation is completed. No complaint or appeal regarding a judge's decision or method of selection will be considered.
 - c. Show officials may excuse an exhibitor from the ring and exclude them from further competition if an exhibitor, in any way, whether in person or by their representative interferes or shows disrespect to a judge or show official.
 - d. In the event that an exhibitor or animal is disqualified after they have been awarded premiums or awards, the exhibitor or animal placing immediately below them may be moved up to fill the vacated position at the discretion of the Shows and Exhibits Committee.
- 30. Rules for high point awards:
 - a. For each point show: First place 2 points; Second place 1 point; Division Champion 3 points; Reserve Division Champion - 2 points; Grand Champion - 5 points; and Reserve Grand Champion - 4 points. Best of Polled receives 1 point but does not count toward overall points.
 - b. Get of Sire and Produce of Dam points go toward Exhibitor/Breeder of the Year Awards.
 - c. Points will stay with animal if sold.
 - d. The Sire and Dam of the Year should have points from at least two (2) different offspring.
 - e. All points earned at the National Open Show are to be doubled.
- 31. SGBI and its representatives have the authority to require such tests as they deem necessary to verify the accuracy of the classification, pedigree of exhibited animals, and parentage verification of Star 5, including calves exhibited at the side of any female. "Said authority shall extend to and cover the enforcement of all show rules as adopted by SGBI."

Overall Senior Champion

Theron Jones Memorial Award:

Is presented in recognition and remembrance of Theron Jones to the 4-H or FFA member whose show animal is selected as the Overall Champion Female. Theron Jones exhibited at the Oklahoma State Fair every year from 1936 with a barrow to 2000 with his Jerseys. Theron bought his first Jerseys in 1943 and exhibited them locally and nationally through 2000. He began teaching agriculture education at Vanoss, Oklahoma in 1945, moved to Tuttle in 1948 and remained there until retirement, to continue teaching on his farm and conducting tours for thousands of Oklahoma City children. These tours earned him a feature article in Orbit magazine. Jones was a friend to many and grandpa to the hundreds of children he helped through the years. In addition to teaching, Jones was also dedicated to service, holding the office of president, at one time or another, in the following organizations: Grady County Fair Board, Tuttle Lions Club, Oklahoma Purebred Dairy Cattle Association, Oklahoma Jersey Cattle Association and Sooner State Dairy Show. He also served as an Oklahoma State Fair Dairy Superintendent for 30-plus years, an elder in the Tuttle Church of Christ and on the executive board of the Oklahoma DHIA. The Overall Champion Junior Show Award, sponsored by the friends of Theron Jones, is given annually.

The Oklahoma State Fair will present a plaque and \$100 to the Overall Senior Champion exhibitor.

Overall Senior Reserve Champion

Ernest R. Berousek Memorial Award:

Is presented in recognition and remembrance of Ernest Berousek, PhD to the 4-H or FFA member whose show animal is selected as Reserve Overall Champion Female. Ernest Berousek was a lifelong Guernsey enthusiast, supporter of the Oklahoma dairy industry and youth activities. He purchased his first dairy heifer in 1934, from the E.K. Gaylord Farm. The next year he purchased two more heifers and with his brother Otto, this was the beginning of building the nationally known, Lily Lane Guernsey Herd. Ernie continued his education, graduating from Oklahoma A and M, while working at the college dairy earning money for his college education. He went on and earned his master's degree from the University of MO and a PhD in Dairy Breeding. During his lifetime, he was awarded "The Pioneer Award" from the National Dairy Shire and "The Master Breeder Award" from the American Guernsey Association. Ernie passed away in 2010 at the age of 92 and he still owned his Guernseys at his passing.

The Oklahoma State Fair will provide a \$75 premium to the Overall Senior Reserve Champion exhibitor.

Walter Bloom Memorial Award:

This award is presented in honor of the premier showman and breeders of Brown Swiss cattle in the state of Oklahoma. Don and Shirley's Head's crest prefix is recognized for outstanding show cattle. Both have had the opportunity to serve on national committees, such as national youth fun auction and national type committee. Don's ability as a cowman extraordinaire has been utilized by the National Brown Swiss Association as the national show judge in Peru, Columbia, and Ecuador. - 2. A registration certificate from one (1) of the following associations is required for each animal entered: ABGA, U.S. Boer Goat Association or Canadian Boer Goat Association
- 3. A stamped duplicate or faxed duplicate registration application showing the date received by the association is acceptable only for animals under 6 months of age.
- 4. Proof of ownership shall be the name on the registration certificate. Persons showing animals whose registration certificates have signed transfers that have not been processed by the breed association office must show those animals as an agent for the owner on placings sent to the breed association.
- 5. Goats must have legible tattoos that match the tattoo shown on the registration papers. This will also fulfill the identification requirements of the Oklahoma Scrapie Program. Tattoos will be examined at check-in and then verified in the ring, as appropriate.
- 6. An animal may be judged in only one (1) age class. Proof of birth date will be the date on the registration certificate. The base date for computing the age of the animal shall be the date of the show.
- 7. A senior buck must have offspring resulting from live coverage; a senior doe must have offspring resulting from natural birth.
- 8. Premier Exhibitor will be the exhibitor (determined by SSN on entry) winning the most money on eight (8) animals exhibited by exhibitor in the non-group classes.

- 3. Registration and Recordation Certificates:
 - a. Only goats registered with ADGA, AGS or CGS are eligible to compete. Those goats who have applied for registration with the above organizations may also compete.
 - b. No copies of the registration/recordation certificate or the stamped duplicate application shall be accepted by show officials.
 - c. Proof of ownership shall be the name on the registration, recordation certificate or stamped duplicate application.
 - d. Information obtained from the ADGA office via telephone, email, fax, etc. will not be accepted in lieu of the documents specified above.
- 4. The base date for computing the age of the animals is September 19/20, the date the animal is to be judged.
- 5. In all classes, an exhibitor is the owner of the animal as evidenced by the name on the registration or recordation certificate or on the stamped duplicate application.
- 6. All group classes of a breed must be made up of only those animals that have been shown in those individual classes of that breed in this show and must be entered on the official entry form.



- 2. This show will be run in accordance with ILR guidelines.
- 3. Individual Llama and Alpaca ILR/AOA/ARI or CLRC registration numbers and ALSA membership numbers must be provided with online entries.
- 4. In addition to processing online entries with OSF and mailing or faxing the required support documentation (copies of registration papers, W-9) to OSF, a copy of the ShoWorks Entry Confirmation and International Llama Registry (ILR) registration papers <u>MUST</u> also be mailed to Christina Abel, PO Box 241, Turpin OK 73950 (OR) emailed to <u>luckyonyx81@gmail.com</u> (indicate Oklahoma State Fair in subject line).
- 5. There will be no check-in without papers: NO EXCEPTIONS.
- 6. All llamas and alpacas must have ILR or CLRC registrations; Alpacas: AOA, ARI or CLRC registrations. (Exception: Youth or Gelding classes with veterinary certificate.)
- 7. IMPORTANT INFORMATION REGARDING MEMBERSHIP AND SHOW POINTS: Membership is required to be eligible for show points in ALSA and/or ILR. OSF will not be responsible for verifying your need for membership.
- 8. It is necessary to pay ALSA/ILR per animal fees FOR EACH/ALL ANIMALS with entries.
- 9. Youth events:
 - a. Youth Incentive Award: \$1,000. Placements in Senior Youth Classes #06, 13, 21 and 42 will be used to tabulate the High Point Senior Youth (60% of incentive) and the Reserve High Point Senior Youth (40% of incentive).
 - b. All youth between the ages of 7 and 19 as of January 1, 2023, may show in ALSA approved Youth classes. At any time an individual turns 20 they are no longer eligible to show in Youth designated classes.

- 10. All Llamas and Alpacas, (in-state and out-of-state), must be accompanied by an official health certificate issued within 30 days of the arrival at the OSF. No blood tests required. Health papers will be checked upon arrival at OKCF.
- 11. The date for determining the animal's age is September 23, 2023.
- 12. Handler's attire should be conservative, neat and appropriate for the class. Shoes must be worn and be appropriate. (Open toe shoes, sandals, and bare feet will disqualify the exhibitor.)
- 13. Classes with less than 3 animals may be combined at discretion of OSF Show Management.
- 14. Classes numbered 01 03, 06, 07, 10, 13, 14, 17, 18, 21, 22, 25, 26, 29, 30, and 33 43, will be open to Llamas and/or Alpacas. Will be designated (*) on following class list.

 - Light / Medium Wool: Minimal to long body wool, short to moderate neck wool, smooth to moderate leg wool

 - Suri: The fleece of a Suri Llama should drape over the llama's body forming a natural part along the spine.

- 6. Bellies, heads, lower legs and dock area may have wool of any length preferred by exhibitor, but wool must not be trimmed or blocked to unequal lengths on chest, back, shoulders, sides or britches areas.
- 7. Wool must be free of excessive vegetable contamination, manure, pain, permanent stains, wool rot or breaks or tenderness. Preferred wool length is two (2) inches.
- 8. All wool grades will show in separate divisions. Show management reserves the right to combine divisions if entries are low. The divisions are as follows:
 - Division 1244: Fine Wool
 - Division 1245: Medium Wool
 - Division 1246: Long Wool
 - Division 1247: Coarse/Primitive Wool
 - Division 1248: Overall Champions
- 9. **All animals entered in any group class must also be duly entered into another individual class.

SWINE HEALTH DOCUMENTATION REQUIREMENTS

- All swine must be accompanied by an official Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) processed and issued within 30 days of the date of arrival at OSF, that shows <u>official</u> individual identification by an <u>840 electronic tag</u>, complete description of livestock as to age, sex, breed, and that they are free of external parasites, ringworms, or warts, or any infectious, contagious, or communicable disease. <u>All swine must have a premises ID listed on the CVI.</u>
- In-state swine must have a negative test for Brucellosis and Pseudorabies after May 15, 2023 or be from a Validated Brucellosis/Qualified Pseudorabies Free Herd and be exhibited by the owners and/or immediate family members. The last quarterly test date (July test) must be listed on the CVI.
 - <u>Breeding gilts</u> should be quarantined and retested 30 days after the show before being commingled with other breeding swine.
 - <u>Out-of-state swine</u> must have a CVI, an entry permit, proof of negative test for Brucellosis and Pseudorabies <u>within 30 days of entry to the fair</u> or be from a Validated/Qualified Herd <u>with verification of the</u> <u>last quarterly test within 3 months and</u> be identified with an official individual USDA Ear Tag.

SWINE BREED CHARACTERISTICS GUIDELINES

Berkshire

- o A black and white animal with erect ears exhibiting Berkshire characteristics.
- A Berkshire must have white on all four (4) legs, face, and tail, unless the tail is docked. One (1) of the white leg points may also be missing.
- Must be ear notched within seven (7) days of birth.
- o A Berkshire must NOT have a solid white or solid black face from the ears forward.
- A Berkshire must NOT have a solid black nose rim of nose.
- White is allowed on the ears, but NO solid white may appear.
- \circ $\;$ An occasional splash of white may appear on the body.

Chester White

- o Must possess Chester White breed characteristics.
- Must be ear notched within seven (7) days of birth.
- o Must be solid white in color, no color on the skin larger than a silver dollar, no colored hair.
- Any skin pigmentation, other than white, that exceeds five (5) in number is disqualified.
- Ears must be down and medium size.
- Any signs of weighted ear tags or evidence of past existence of such tags are determined to be not permissible and are grounds for disqualification.

Duroc

- Must be red in color and possess Duroc breed characteristics.
- Ears must be down and medium size.
- Must be ear notched within seven (7) days of birth.
- Must NOT have any white or black hair on the animal.
- Must NOT have more than three (3) black spots on the skin, none of which can be larger than 2 inches in diameter.
- Must NOT have any shading or indication of a belt.

Hampshire

- Must possess Hampshire breed characteristics.
- Ears must be erect and not rounded.
- Must be black in color with a white belt starting on the front leg. The belt may be partially or totally encircling the body.
- Must be ear notched within seven (7) days of birth.
- Must NOT have any white hair or indications of streaking on the forehead.
- Must not have any red hair.



Hereford

- Must be red, light, or dark however, with a white head, ears, and 4 white legs.
- Ears must be at least broke forward.
- Hereford Market Animals. Shall be eligible with at least 50% of a white face, at least 50% red body, at least 2 white feet. This will be known as the *50-50-50 rule".
- Must be ear notched within seven (7) days of birth.
- Reporting of belts and black spots in breeding animals off springs. Belts and black spots do appear occasionally. It is the job of the breeders and members to do their best to eliminate this from their herds.

Landrace (Gilts only eligible to show)

- Must be white in color and possess Landrace breed characteristics (ears must be down).
- Must be ear notched within seven days of birth.
- o Must NOT allow any color hair other than white.
- Must NOT allow more than three (3) spots of skin pigmentation.
- o Must NOT allow any spot of skin pigmentation larger than one U.S. minted quarter.
- Must have no evidence of an extra dewclaw.

Poland China

- o Must possess Poland China breed characteristics.
- Must be ear notched within seven (7) days of birth.
- Must be black with six (6) white points face, feet, and tail with an occasional splash of white on the body. A hog
 may not possess more than one (1) black leg and to be determined as a Poland China. Tail docking is
 permissible, eliminating that white point.
- Must have ears down.
- Must NOT have evidence of belt formation.
- Cannot have any red or sandy hair and/or pigment.
- Hogs that have weighted ear tags or evidence of such tampering are ineligible.
- Must NOT have any colored hair, other than white or black.
- Must NOT have any red or blue colored skin pigmentation larger than a silver dollar.
- Must NOT have masking above the eyes larger than a silver dollar.
- Any signs of weighted ear tags or evidence of past existence of such tags are determined to be not permissible and are grounds for disqualification.

Spot

- Must possess Spot breed characteristics.
- Must be black and white in color.
- Must be ear notched within seven (7) days of birth.
- Ears must be down and reasonably sized.
- Any red tinted or sandy brown spots are ineligible.
- No solid black head from ears forward.
- No distinct white belt pattern hair or skin encircling and extending down and onto each shoulder.
- Any signs of weighted ear tags or evidence of past existence of such tags are determined to be not permissible and are grounds for disqualification.

Yorkshire

- o Must be white in color and possess Yorkshire breed characteristics.
- Ears must be erect.
- Must be ear notched within seven (7) days of birth.
- Must NOT have any colored hair, other than white.
- o Must NOT have colored skin pigmentation larger than a silver dollar.
- o Must NOT have masking above the eyes larger than a silver dollar.

SPECIAL AWARDS

James White Memorial Trophy

Traveling Trophy presented to the exhibitor of the Grand Champion Barrow.

Dr. James D. White, a native of Lindsay, Oklahoma, devoted more than 30 years of his life to youth education, in both public schools and higher education. After five years as a high school agriculture education instructor in Davenport, he returned to Oklahoma State University (OSU) to attend graduate school. After completion of graduate school, he accepted a position as a faculty member in the agriculture education department at OSU. White received many honors through the years including: an Honorary American Farmer Degree, OVATA Gold-Teacher of Teachers Award and the Outstanding Academic Advisor in the OSU College of Agriculture. He was a great supporter of youth livestock activities and the Oklahoma State Fair for his entire career. This included many behind the scenes activities, for which he never received or expected recognition, and helping with the OSF Golden Pork Chop Contest, Junior Barrow Show and Junior Lamb Show. He recruited OSU College of Agriculture students for State Fair interns and student helpers at the livestock shows. He was also a FFA Meats Judging Contest superintendent at the Spring Oklahoma Youth Livestock Show for many years. White was recognized nationally for his enthusiasm, zeal, and dedication to teaching youth. His work ethics and honesty are beyond reproach, and an inspiration to us all.

Poland China Record Association Special Award

The Poland China Record Association (PCRA), P.O. 9758, Peoria IL 61612-9758, will present a trophy to the Grand Champion Barrow exhibitor over all breeds, providing it is out of a recorded Poland China sire and dam. A picture of the winning animal, barrow certificate and certification by OSF must be sent to the PCRA within 30 days of the show. The PCRA will award \$15 worth of future recording credit to the exhibitor of the Champion Poland China Barrow for each 20 head, with a minimum of 20, of Poland Chinas exhibited upon receipt of the winner's registration number, number of Poland Chinas exhibited, and name and address of exhibitor from show officials.

The National Swine Registry (NSR), P.O. Box 2417, West Lafayette, Indiana, 47996, is a consolidation of the American Yorkshire Club, Hampshire Swine Registry, and the United Duroc Swine Registry. The NSR offers \$50 to the owner of the Grand Champion Barrow overall all breeds, provided the barrow is a registered Duroc, Hampshire or Yorkshire and from a recorded litter. The owner must provide proof of registration and a picture to receive their award.

Using materials directly or modified from the Learning Laboratory Kits, as well as activities developed from information provided in and adapted from the Ohio 4-H Animal Resource Handbooks, Oklahoma State University Extension Fact Sheets and various other sources. Skillathons are created to challenge the exhibitor's knowledge of all aspects of each respective animal species. Each Skillathon is comprised of four (4) educational and challenging activities stations. Youth move from station to station, attempting to perform the tasks they are given. A facilitator is present to offer <u>directions only</u> if needed. Station scores are recorded on the exhibitor's score sheet by facilitator and entered into a computer program that calculates each youth's placing.
- Topics to be expected: quality assurance, animal anatomy, nutrition, meat cut identification, reproduction and genetics, diseases, and animal care.

ADDITIONAL RULES

- All Skillathons are open to 4-H member and FFA members (see eligibility rules under <u>"Junior/Youth Show Eligibility</u>"). Therefore, 4-H and FFA members turning 19 on or before September 15, 2023 are too old to participate in the Skillathons. Youth do not have to be an exhibitor at the Fair to participate.
- 2. If it is determined at the completion of the Skillathon that an exhibitor was entered in the wrong age division, the exhibitor will be disqualified from the competition and not eligible for placings or awards. Parents: Verify with your county extension professional your child's correct 4-H age, as this is the basis for age classification.
- Once you register for the Skillathon, you must wait for your turn and expect to go through the line when called. Once you enter the Skillathon, you CANNOT leave. If you leave, you forfeit any further participation in that Skillathon.
- 4. Skillathon participants are not permitted to bring study materials or electronic devices, such as cell phones, into the evaluation area.
- 5. Ties for Skillathon awards and age class placings will be broken by the following procedure:
 - a. First Skillathon Station no. 2 score
 - b. Second Skillathon Station no. 3 score
 - c. Third Skillathon Station no. 4 score
 - d. An additional fifth "Tiebreaker Station" may be administered.
- 6. The four (4) subject matter station categories for each species will be posted on the respective species bulletin board closest to the show arena.
- 7. Participants not entered in Livestock Show competitions will be required to purchase admission into the Fair.

ADDITIONAL RULES

- 1. Alfalfa exhibits must have been produced in the state of Oklahoma during 2023. Any producer is eligible to enter two (2) exhibits in class 1.
- 2. Three (3) bales will constitute an entry.
- 3. A composite sample for analysis must be submitted through the **County Extension Office** to: Marty New, South Central Research Station, 1105 E Iowa Ave, Chickasha, OK 73018.
- 4. All Entries will be judged as individual exhibits. However, entries may be submitted as a group by a county or local hay association (e.g.: X exhibits for X county) before the names of the individual exhibitors are known. This is to accommodate the hay shows taking place after the entry deadline of August 25. Check with your local Oklahoma State University (OSU) County Extension Center to determine if this procedure will be followed in your county. Exhibitors do not have to compete in a county hay show to exhibit in this show.
- 5. The alfalfa hay show superintendent must receive a composite sample from three (3) bales, to be entered no later than August 28, 2023. Sample bags, instructions for sampling and a sampling probe are available at each OSU County Extension Center. This sampling probe should be used to obtain a valid, representative sample under the direction of the County Extension director. These samples will be used for the protein analysis and must be submitted by the local OSU County Extension Center.
- 6. Factors considered by the judges include protein, relative feed value, maturity, texture, leafiness, and freedom from foreign material, color, size and shape of bales, odor, and freedom from mold.
- 7. In lieu of an entry fee, all hay becomes the property of OSF to cover the cost of analysis.

- The purpose of this competition is to enhance youth's skills in: (a) researching and gaining knowledge of a wide variety of agricultural content and (b) practicing their ability to think and speak under pressure without prior rehearsal.
- A panel of judges will use a scoresheet to evaluate the contestants in forming a non-prepared speech based on verbal and non-verbal communication skills.
- There will be two classes of contestants, according to age Juniors and Seniors.
- Speech topics will be randomly drawn by the contestant in the following agricultural categories:
 - 1. AgriBusiness & Policy
 - 2. Agricultural Education
 - 3. Animal Science
- 4. Biotechnology & Food Products
- 5. Environmental, Plant & Natural Resources
- 6. Power, Structural & Technology

- Membership in 4-H or FFA is not required to enter.
- Contestants must not have won a state or national-level extemporaneous public speaking event prior to this competition.

NEW SEntries will be limited to the first 25 speakers who enter online, regardless of age. One (1) parking pass and one (1) single day admission credentials will be mailed to contestants who enter by August 25, 11:59 p.m.

- a. Late entries submitted after August 26 will not receive parking or admission to enter the fairgrounds and will be responsible for the purchase of parking and admission. Late entries will need to receive and fill out an entry form by emailing agmanager@okstatefair.com.
- Entries will be accepted until all 25 contestant slots are filled or by September 11, whichever comes first.
- Accepted entries will be confirmed via e-mail provided when entering the competition.

COMPETITION FORMAT & RULES

- 1. The competition will start at 9 a.m. with one 30-minute break for judges.
- NEW Speech Time Sign-Up: Each confirmed contestant will select a pre-determined time to arrive to Barn 3 Meeting Room on September 17. After entries close, OSF will send contestants a link to select their speech time on September 12. Each time slot will be 40 minutes (30 minutes for check-in and preparation, 10 minutes for speech and questions). Please communicate with OSF staff if there are any issues with the participant's selected time slot and we will do our best to accommodate.
 - 3. **Attire:** Contestants should wear business attire or attire representative of the group or club they are representing (i.e., official organization attire).
 - 4. Approved research material to bring or use in holding room:
 - a. Using the computers in the holding room provided by OSF.
 - b. Bringing up to five (5) printed material documents (such as books, magazines, or printed internet research) OR one binder consisting of such printed materials consisting of a maximum of 100 pages single-sided or 50 pages double-sided.
 - c. Contestants may not use notes or speeches from a previous competition or by another speaker.
 - d. Contestants may bring blank flashcards to take notes on for their speech; however, the use of flashcards will be a criterion for points if they provide a distraction from the speech.

5. Arrival:

- a. One single day admission and parking pass will be mailed to all contestants entered online by August 25. Any guests accompanying contestants will be required to purchase admission in advance or at the gate upon arrival.
- b. Contestants and guests will need to enter (walk through admission only) OKC Fairgrounds via Gate 7 or Gate 8, both opening at 6:30 a.m. or any gate after 8 a.m.
- c. Contestants must arrive by their pre-determined time slot in Barn 3 Meeting Room (across the south-hall of Barn 3 Auditorium) for check-in. Contestants arriving late to check-in will be subject to penalization.
- NEW 😧 d. Upon check-in, contestants will receive a brief overview of the contest and given an opportunity to ask questions. Competition staff may ask to view contestant materials brought into the room to ensure compliance with rule #4.
 - e. No phones, tablets, headphones, or any other electronic device is allowed in the holding room. If any such items are brought, competition staff will store these items until the speech is finished.
 - f. Contestants will then randomly choose a topic/question within their chosen category of agriculture. Remaining time will be the contestant's speech preparation period.

NEW 🔀 Speech Time Limit:

a. JUNIORS:

- i. Speeches must be 4 5 minutes long. Speeches outside of this time frame will be given a **1-point deduction for every 10 seconds** under or over the time limit.
- ii. There will be a **1-minute warning** for contestants, given at the 4-minute mark.
- b. SENIORS:
 - i. Speeches must be 5 7 minutes long. Speeches outside of this time frame will be given a **1-point deduction for every 10 seconds** under or over the time limit.
 - ii. There will be a **1-minute warning** for contestants, given at the 6-minute mark.
- 7. Official competition staff will be present in the holding room to monitor preparation. They will also introduce speakers and their chosen topic before the speaker begins their speech.
- 8. The Barn 3 Auditorium will be open to all guests and spectators to watch presentations. However, contestants will not be allowed to enter the Auditorium before their scheduled presentation time. Contestants who violate this rule will be disqualified. After the completion of their speech, contestants are welcome to watch other speakers. All cell phones must be muted prior to entry.
- 9. Assistance, coaching, suggestions, or any other form of guidance from anyone in the audience during the presentation is prohibited. Such actions from the audience may result in disqualification of the contestant.
- 10. **Props:** The use of props (i.e., posters, live/fake animals, electronics, or objects of any kind) is prohibited and will result in disqualification from competition if used.
- 11. Following the completion of their speech, each contestant is given three additional minutes for questions from the judges relating to their speech and chosen topic. Contestants will be scored on their capability to answer the judges' questions.



NEW 😭 Release & Awards Ceremony:

a. Contestants are able to leave as soon as they complete their speech. However, there will be a formal awards ceremony for contestants following the completion of the speech contest. Ribbons and plaques will be distributed at this time. If contestants win a plaque but are not at the ceremony, the contestant will need to coordinate pick up of awards. Plaques desired to be shipped will have the cost of shipping reduced from their premium earnings. Awards will be held at the Livestock Show Office during the remainder of the Fair or at the OKC Fairgrounds Administration Building post-Fair.

JUDGING INFORMATION

- The judges panel will consist of at least three judges. They will include, but not limited to, agricultural industry experts, OSF employees, volunteers or other such individuals who provide agricultural and public speaking knowledge as well as impartial evaluation of each participant.
- A timekeeper will record the speaker's time.
- Judges will have a maximum of three minutes to ask the speaker questions.
- After the completion of each contestant, judges will use the provided rubric to score each participant. The contestants will then be ranked based off of their total score, including any time refractions.
- Judging sheets will be compiled at the end of the competition to determine the official contestant ranking.

- 1. **2023 Weigh-Off will be held in Barn 3 Auditorium.** Detailed instructions will be sent to the email address provided with entries. See "Unloading/Loading Procedure" below for competition specific instructions.
- 2. All entries are subject to the rules and regulations of the Oklahoma State Fair (OSF) and the Great Pumpkin Commonwealth (GPC). For GPC rules, please visit: <u>https://gpc1.org/</u>
- 3. This weigh-off competition is open to all growers world-wide.
- 4. Growers who are Oklahoma 4-H and FFA members are eligible and encouraged to enter the 4-H and FFA Giant Pumpkin Competitions. See the respective 4-H and FFA Exhibit Competition Guides for more information.
- 5. One (1) entry of each single-variety of fruit per grower/team is allowed to enter the weigh-off competition. Additional fruit can be brought and weighed for exhibit purposes.
- 6. Since the forklift is used elsewhere on grounds during the Fair, it is encouraged for growers to indicate their intended arrival/departure times for OSF to plan in advance and make availability for equipment use. Growers not indicating specific arrival/departure times will be subject to availability of equipment.
 - a. A pallet jack will be in the area for unloading/loading/moving fruit of smaller sizes, during arrival and departure allotted times.
- 7. Fruit will be weighed at the weigh-off on Saturday, September 16 to determine the heaviest fruit.
- 8. It is highly encouraged to leave fruit entries until the end of the Oklahoma State Fair, September 24, for public viewing. Growers allowing the display of their produce for the duration of the Fair may be granted additional admission to the Fair. Please indicate your willingness to leave your fruit by emailing Brooke Cecil at agmanager@okstatefair.com or upon check in.
 - a. Fruit which is not picked up by September 26 at 10 a.m. will be donated to a local organization/business or will be discarded.



- b. Growers of decomposing fruit will be notified and asked to coordinate with OSF management staff to have fruit removed from the barn. OSF reserves the right to remove decomposing fruit if owner(s) cannot be reached or are unavailable to remove the fruit upon request by OSF management.
- c. It will be the grower's responsibility to coordinate the removal of seeds from the fruit, if so desired, prior to disposal or donation at the end of the Fair. OSF will not be responsible for harvesting seeds or for seeds left in decomposing/discarded fruit.

9. ENTRIES PROCESSED BY AUGUST 25:

- a. Entry into this competition will authorize one grower or team of up to two growers two admission tickets (or four admission tickets for a team) and one (1) parking pass/hangtag (good for any paid/permit parking lot for a passenger vehicle **without** a trailer or for parking a trailer in Exhibitor Parking Lot). The parking pass does not guarantee a parking place.
- b. Growers are able to purchase one additional Exhibitor Parking Lot Pass with their entries by August 25. They are not available for purchase after this date.
- c. Any complimentary and purchased admissions and parking passes (credentials) will be distributed to you upon arrival.


10. ENTRIES AFTER AUGUST 25:

- a. Entries are to be made online until midnight on September 13.
- b. LATE ENTRIES:
 - i. Entries are considered late between August 25 September 13. No late entry fee is applied at this time.
 - ii. However, interested growers must contact Brooke Cecil to obtain a bypass code to make online entries and avoid paying the standard Livestock Show late entry fees. Payment for entries will be obtained after entries are received via card payment over the phone.

ARRIVAL PROCEDURE THROUGH GATE 7

 Gate 7 is available for drive in between 6:30 a.m. and 10 p.m. during the Fair, September 14 - 24. On Wednesday, September 13 the gates will open no earlier than noon.

• Growers registered online by September 13:

- 1. When you arrive, you will need to follow the signage to be directed to Gate 7 Check-In. At the location, you will check in with the Gate 7 attendants who will have your credentials. All individuals in the vehicle must have admissions to proceed through the gate.
- 2. After entering through Gate 7, please proceed to the area indicated by the red oval. This is the location of loading/unloading.
- 3. Exit Gate 8 as quickly as possible to park your vehicle and/or trailer. Growers should obtain a hand-stamp from gate attendants to re-enter the fairgrounds.

• Growers not pre-registered will need to:



- 1. Growers and any guests will need to pay for their admission prior-to or upon arrival to Gate 7.
- 2. When you arrive, you will need to follow the signage to be directed to Gate 7 Check-In. Check-in with Gate 7 attendants and let them know you are here for the Giant Pumpkin Weigh-Off. They will allow you temporary access to unload your fruit. However, all individuals will need to obtain admission before entering the gate.
- 3. Proceed to the barns for unloading your fruit.
- 4. Complete registration paperwork and payment to enter the competition with Tom Rovenstine or AgriBusiness Staff. Obtain a trailer parking pass from AgriBusiness Staff, if needed, before exiting the fairgrounds to park.
- 5. Exit Gate 8 as quickly as possible to park your vehicle and/or trailer. Growers should obtain a hand-stamp from gate attendants to re-enter the fairgrounds.
- **WARNING:** Vehicles left unattended or remaining for a long period of time or after designated hours may be towed at the grower's expense.
- Upon exiting Gate 8, growers have two options for parking:
 - Parking is permitted in any paid permit or free parking lot with passenger vehicles ONLY.
 - Growers who are not pre-registered by the deadline will need to pay for parking their passenger vehicles
 or will need to park in a free parking lot.
 - If a trailer is attached/used, grower(s) MUST park the trailer in Exhibitor Trailer Parking Lot. The passenger vehicle can then be moved to another paid permit (with pass) or free parking lot, if desired.
 - **Do NOT** attempt to enter with a vehicle at any time through any other gates.

DEPARTURE PROCEDURE THROUGH GATE 7

- If departing on...
 - September 16: Before exiting the gates to retrieve vehicles, growers should obtain a hand-stamp from gate attendants to re-enter the fairgrounds. Vehicles must display their Exhibitor Parking Pass in vehicle to re-enter Gate 7.
 - September 17– 24: Growers will need to re-enter Gate 7 during Fair operating hours and must display their Exhibitor Parking Pass in vehicle. Growers will need to provide admission for anyone in the vehicle.
 - \circ September 25 or 26: The Fair is closed and no paid admission or parking is necessary.
